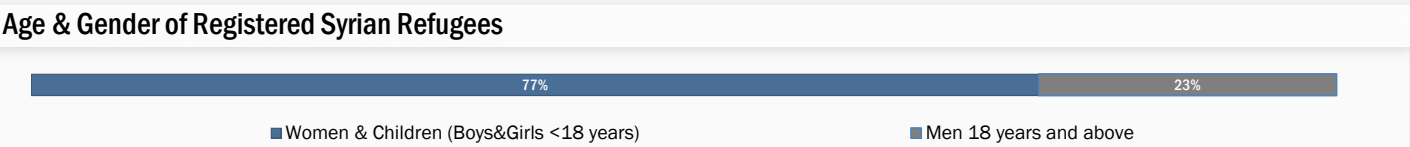
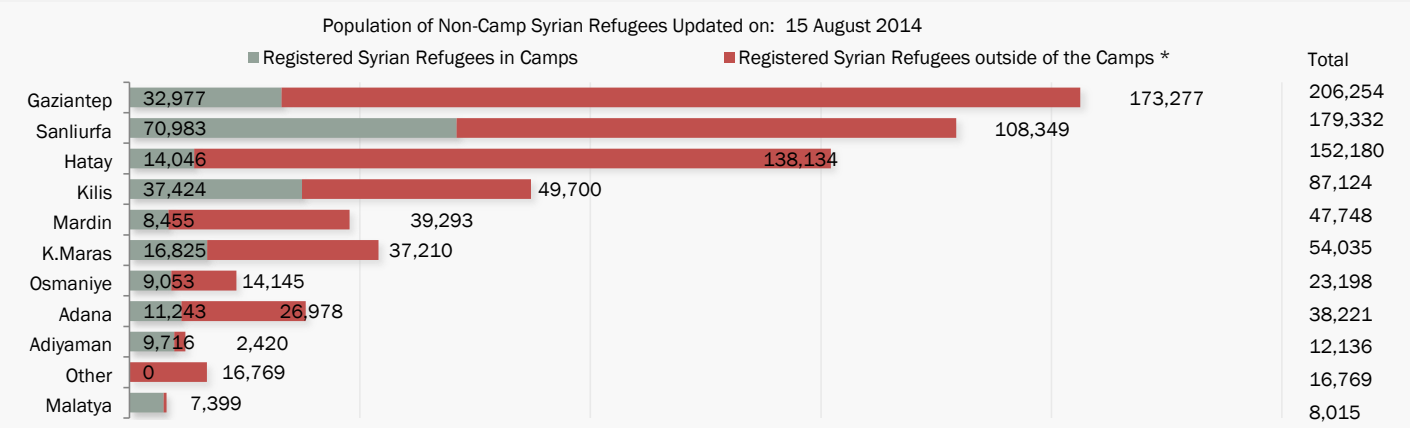
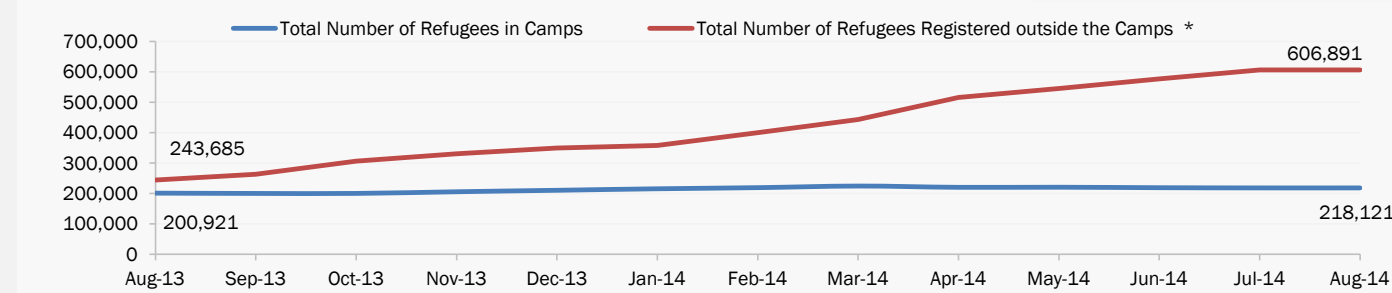

Highlights

- On 21 August, AFAD, the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Turkey's Government, announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in the 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,121. AFAD reported that from 20 to 21 August, a total of 502 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 341 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- During the week officials continued to send some non-camp Syrian families to Viransehir camp. Nevertheless, before this new instruction had entered into force, there were already families waiting at the gate of Viransehir camp to be admitted. Camp officials informed that they have finally admitted the remaining families that were at the gate. There are no more Syrian families at Viransehir gate.
- The registration of non-camp Syrians living in Kirikhan has been done in one of the Mobile Coordination Centers provided by UNHCR. Local officials informed that as of 20 August around 24,000 Syrians have been registered and the number of applications for registrations sharply decreased. Should this trend continue, registration will continue in a new location yet to be determined.
- The WFP/UN compound in Gaziantep has been completed and is operational as of 15 August. In addition to WFP, six other agencies—WHO, UNFPA, IOM, UNICEF, UNHCR and FAO—will have operational presence in the compound.
- In Akcakale the camp officials informed that there are about 200-300 Syrians approaching the gate on a daily basis requesting to be admitted to the camp, however due to the shortage in capacity they can not admit them. Reportedly some of these people leave in the evenings and return the next day. Camp officials assume that some of these people have a place stay but still insist to be admitted to Akcakale camp. Some were asked if they wish to be transferred to another camp but they refused.
