



## KEY FACT OF THE MONTH

**20,838** refugees benefitted from empowerment activities sessions in July 2014

### HIGHLIGHTS:

Approximately 36,290 Syrian refugees were registered in July, also 28,011 requested new appointments, with an average waiting period of 22 days countrywide. The decrease in request for appointments and high no show rate are due to ) due to Eid Holiday and end of Ramadan. By the end of July 1,138,874 Syrian refugees were registered or awaiting registration. Total iris enrollment stands at 557,369 individuals representing 70% of the RRP6 population target. The Number of PRS recorded in July decreased with 41,000 PRS recorded with UNRWA due to the severe governmental restrictions to renew their legal stay in Lebanon.


In July, individual legal counseling was provided to 2,986 individuals, largely Syrian refugees (83%) and PRS (17%), including in official detention facilities, Marriage and Birth registration as well as in submission of Mercy Request to GSO in order to regularize their stay in Lebanon. From January, almost 18,480 individuals received legal assistance.

In July, more than 13,065 individuals participated in legal awareness sessions and almost 76,128 refugees were informed since the beginning of 2014 on some of their rights. At field level and in Beirut, the major legal sector partners continued to hold regular technical sessions to discuss guidance document for work permits and to share best practices and to coordinate field coverage of legal awareness activities. Curfew practices and confiscation of ID remains a concern monitored at the field level.

In July 2014 more than 1,121 individual cases were submitted for resettlement or humanitarian admission.

### NEEDS ANALYSIS:

There is a need to organize joint trainings and meetings with Refugee Outreach Volunteers (ROV) of the different organizations to maximize resources, harmonize approach and ensure they have a minimum knowledge on the basic protection standards and humanitarian principles, ethics, Code of Conduct and the mandates of all organizations. ROV are regularly reporting high risk cases in need of urgent support or assistance, identifying people with specific needs and referring them to the existing services.
