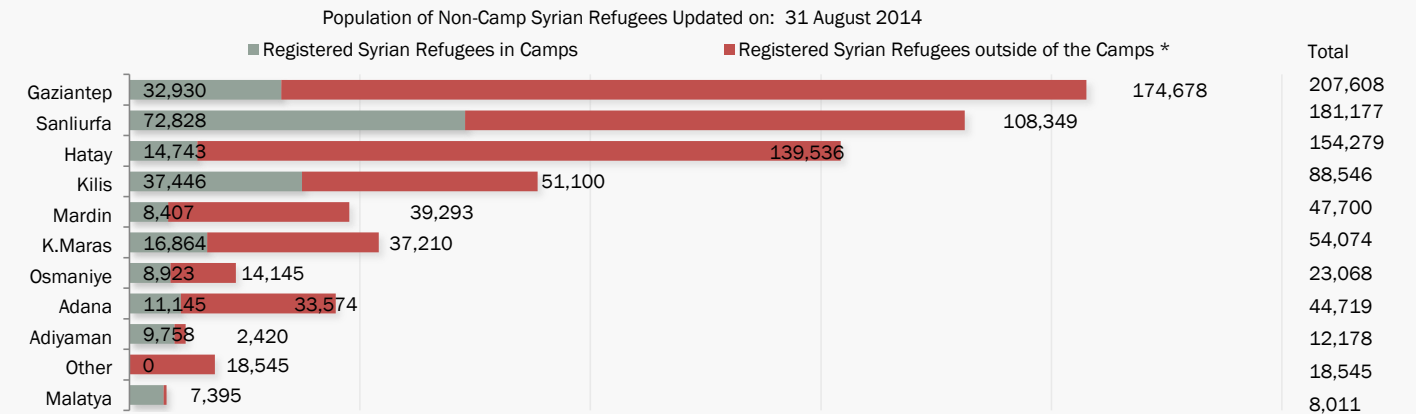
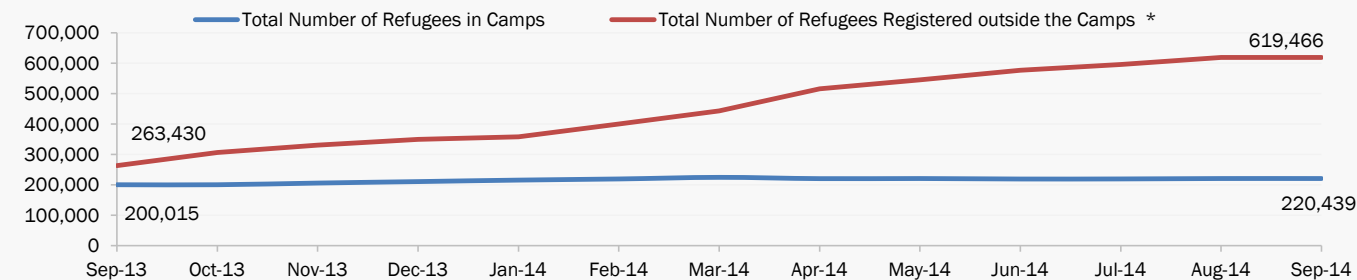
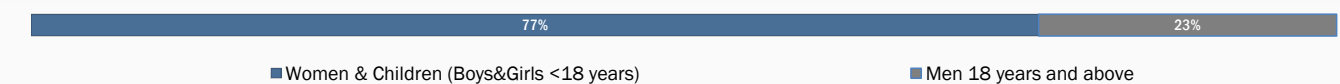


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	839,905

Highlights

- On 31 August, AFAD, the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Turkey's Government, announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in the 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220, 439. AFAD reported that from 29 to 31 August, a total of 1,463 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 735 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria. No new numbers announced by AFAD on 01 Sept 2014.
- Local authorities in Antakya informed that they have reopened the soup kitchen which had been closed due to financial reasons since the municipal elections. The officials stated that the soup kitchen will serve to all people in need including Syrians living in Antakya. Local authorities stated that 3,000 soups for breakfast and 3,000 hot meals for lunch will be served on a daily basis.
- In Adana, camp officials informed that due to having frequent water cuts, they have already stated to search for alternative additional water sources and will drill new boreholes to prevent any serious shortages in the future.
- Ceylanpinar camp management informed that during the month of August, they have admitted and registered about 400 spontaneous arrivals to the gate. Despite all efforts not to turn down anyone or transfer them to another camp, there are still over 80 Syrians temporarily accommodated in the waiting area who will be accommodated in the camp when space becomes available.
- In Kilis local officials stated that the state hospital has an annex building, which, once completed, will increase the capacity of the state hospital with an additional 50 or more beds and 5 more polyclinic rooms for inpatient and outpatient treatment. No doctors have been appointed yet. the annex is expected to decrease the burden on the main building which also provides a significant number of Syrian patients, not only to those living in town, but also wounded persons brought from the Syrian side. Kilis province has a Turkish population of around 80-90 thousand and hosts about more than 50,000 registered non-camp Syrians in addition to about more than 37,000 refugees in two camps.
