



**95,336** Syrian refugees living in camps in Iraq were reached with WASH services

### NOVEMBER HIGHLIGHTS:

**Duhok** governorate: DMC distributed water tanks to 800 families, which will be used to heat water for shower units.

**Erbil** governorate: in **Qushtapa** camp 96 households' sanitation facilities including sewage systems were completed by UNICEF and its partners.

WASH improvement works at the primary health centers in **Darashakran** and **Kawergosk** camps have been completed.

In Al-Obaidi camp in **Anbar** governorate, ISHO has successfully addressed the water shortage. One water pump station is again operational, ensuring that sufficient water is available in the camp.



### NEEDS ANALYSIS:


As the capacities of Basirma and Kawergosk camps have been exhausted, all new arrivals to Erbil governorate were directed to Qushtapa and Darashakran camps.

The authorities decided to cancel the construction of Qushtapa 2 camp, further aggravating refugee shelter limitations.

With all factors above, the construction of WASH facilities to meet the immediate demands of the newly arrived refugees from Kobane remains high priority




### SYRIAN REFUGEE POPULATION IN IRAQ:




### WASH in schools in refugee camps in KR-I
