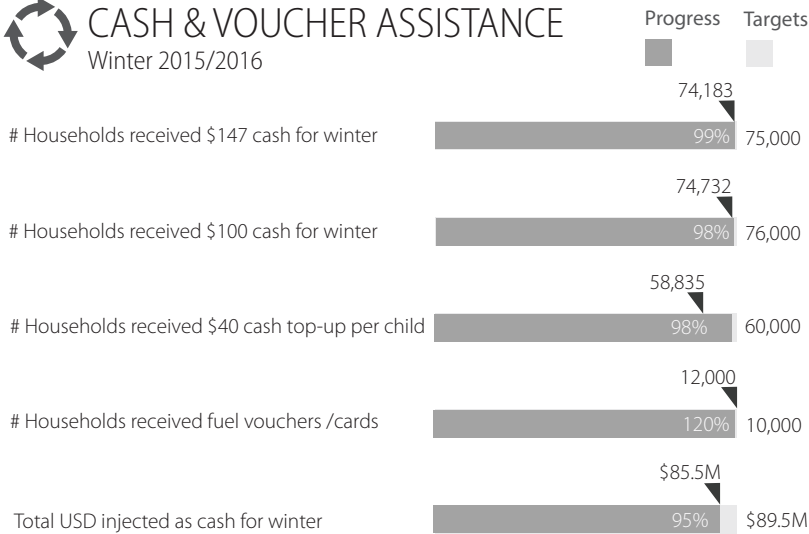
HIGHLIGHTS

The interagency winter support plan was concluded end of March 2016 with a high implementation rate. 33 partners supported 252,364 poor households living in cold areas with cash, vouchers, blankets, stoves, and clothing kit assistance. Shelter and WASH partners provided weatherproofing and drainage kits, and improved site conditions in informal settlements and substandard buildings as well. Compared to last year, this year's plan was better funded. \$107M were secured out of \$117M needed to cover the winter needs of 257,257 households identified country wide.

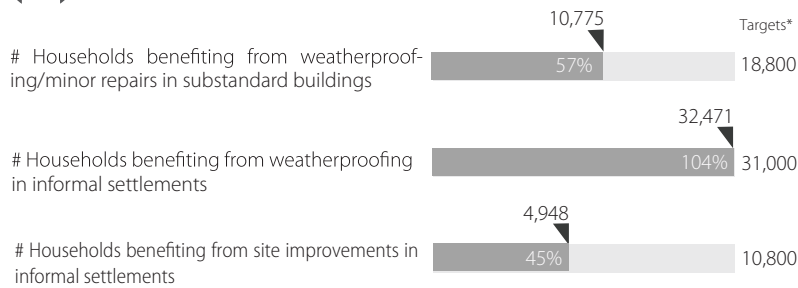

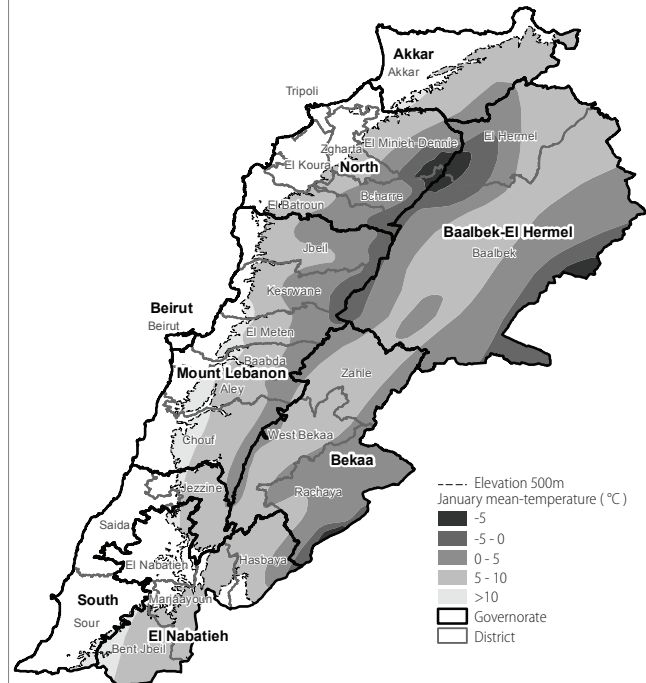
WINTER CASH PACKAGES / CRITERIA

1 SYR 2 LEB 3 PAL

Vulnerable families living above 500 m	\$147 x 4 months
Vulnerable families living below 500 m	\$100 x 4 months
One-off cash for winter top-up (clothing)	\$40/child
Vulnerable families receiving fuel cards in lieu of cash (mainly in Aarsal)	\$100 x 4 months
Lebanese returnee families living above 800 meters and/or with substandard shelter	\$100 x 4 months

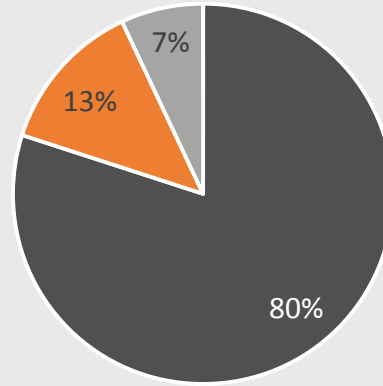

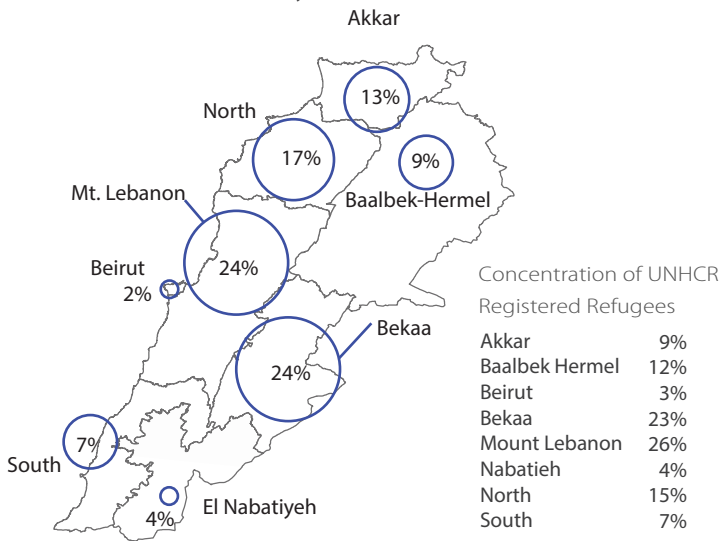
Winter Beneficiaries
by Population Group



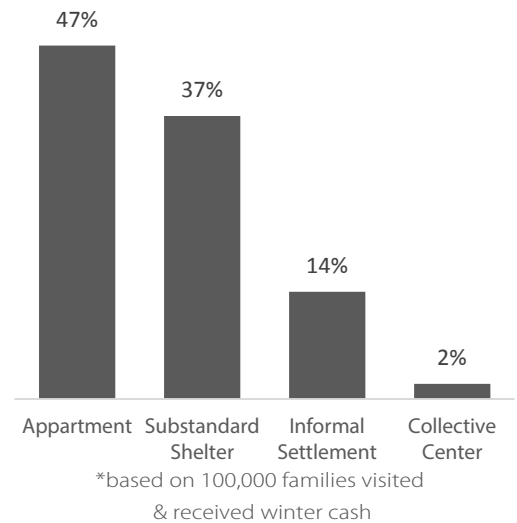

Cash for Winter by Governorate

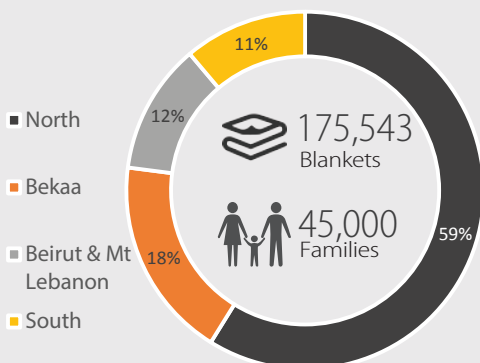


Cash For Winter Beneficiaries
