- Duplications leading to assessment fatigue, gaps
- Lack of harmonized methodology for rapid needs assessments
- Inadequate sharing of assessments results and data collected





## OBJECTIVES

1. Strengthen assessment **coordination**
2. Enhance sharing and **dissemination of information**
3. Strengthen **technical capacity** and preparedness
4. Support advocacy, **awareness raising** and resource mobilization





## WORKPLAN

Includes:

- Establish an harmonized rapid needs assessment structure, methodology and procedure
- Development of survey of surveys platform
- Capacity building on coordinated needs assessment and Multi-sector Initial Rapid Needs Assessment
- Support multi-sector/agency coordinated assessments

# AI and Results Framework

## Meeting 19 February

- Agreed to provide the Pivot tool to sector
- Agreed to use the verification report during verification period
- Agreed to send Dashboard each month
- Requested AI input tool
- Update required of Results Framework

# AI and Results Framework

## Specific Indicator Decisions

- Presence of Funded WASH agency:
  - Mark '1' for **ALL Sites** that the agency has secured funding to cover WASH for **current month and each future month**
  - WASH coverage mapping
- O&M indicators:
  - Mark '1' for all sites that had some level of O&M support during the month (**work undertaken**)
  - Leave blank if no work was done
- 2.2.4 Sludge Removal Indicator
  - Create a new indicator to measure

# WASH Shelter Agreement

- Issue: Capture of WASH data implemented by Shelter partners on AI
  - Organisations with parallel WASH / Shelter teams can report through the WASH teams or
  - Creation of 'Shelter' form on WASH AI that represents only selected and relevant indicators
  - Cohorts: count of tenants not landlords
- **Issue: Drainage activity overlap???**
  - **Review of the TTP**

1.3.1 - # of 500 to 1000 L- HH storage tanks provided
<b>Output/Activity 2.1 Sanitation Facilities</b>
2.1 POC - # of with increased access to sanitation services
2.1.1 - # of Latrines/toilets constructed or rehabilitated.
<b>Output/Activity 2.6 Drainage</b>
2.6 POC - # individuals of with reduced risk of flooding
2.6.1- Site drainage around WASH sites to reduce standing water, benefiting near HHs
2.6.2 - # Measures to reduce flooding risk for flood prone sites

# WASH Stabilisation

- Concept of stabilisation captured in:
  1. Lebanon crisis response plan 2015-2016 (LCRP) for delivering humanitarian and stabilisation programmes that are integrated and mutually reinforcing.
  2. “Lebanon roadmap of priority interventions for stabilisation from the Syrian conflict” (Nov2013, WB/UN).
  3. “Economic and social impact assessment of the Syrian crisis o Lebanon” (Sep2013, WB).
  4. Formal request from Lebanese PM to World Bank to initiate a needs assessment review (Jul 2013).

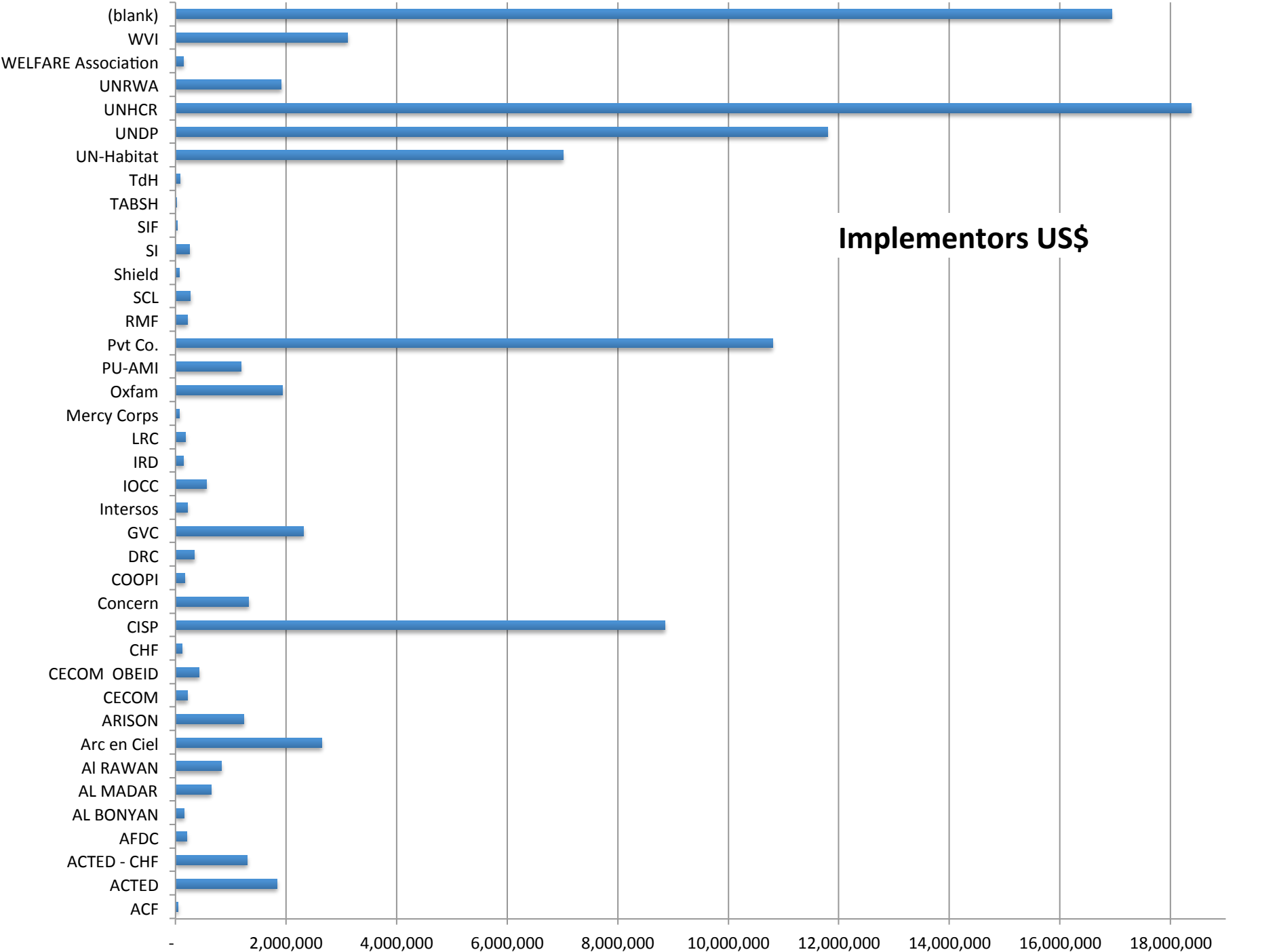

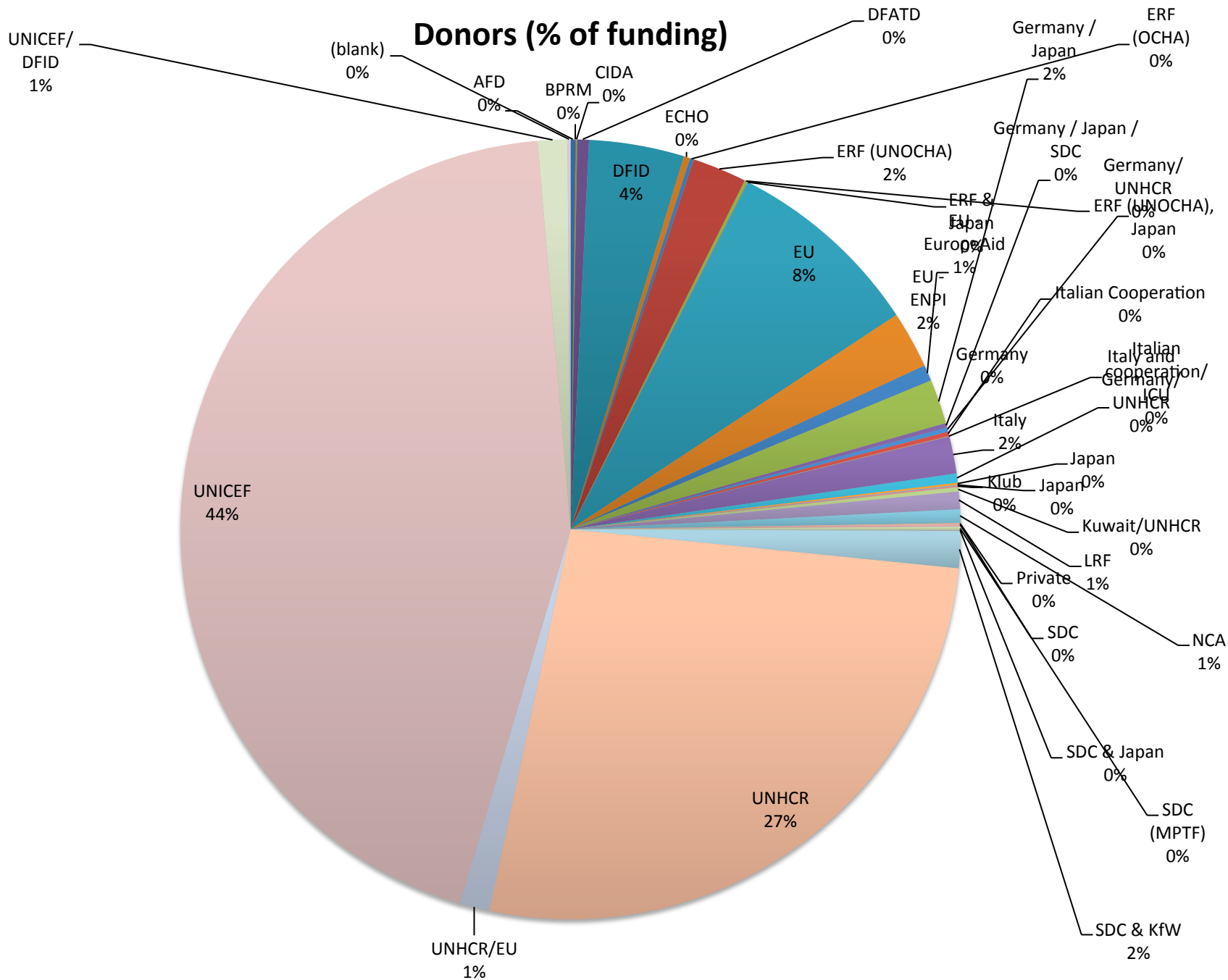
# WASH sector stabilisation

## Master list

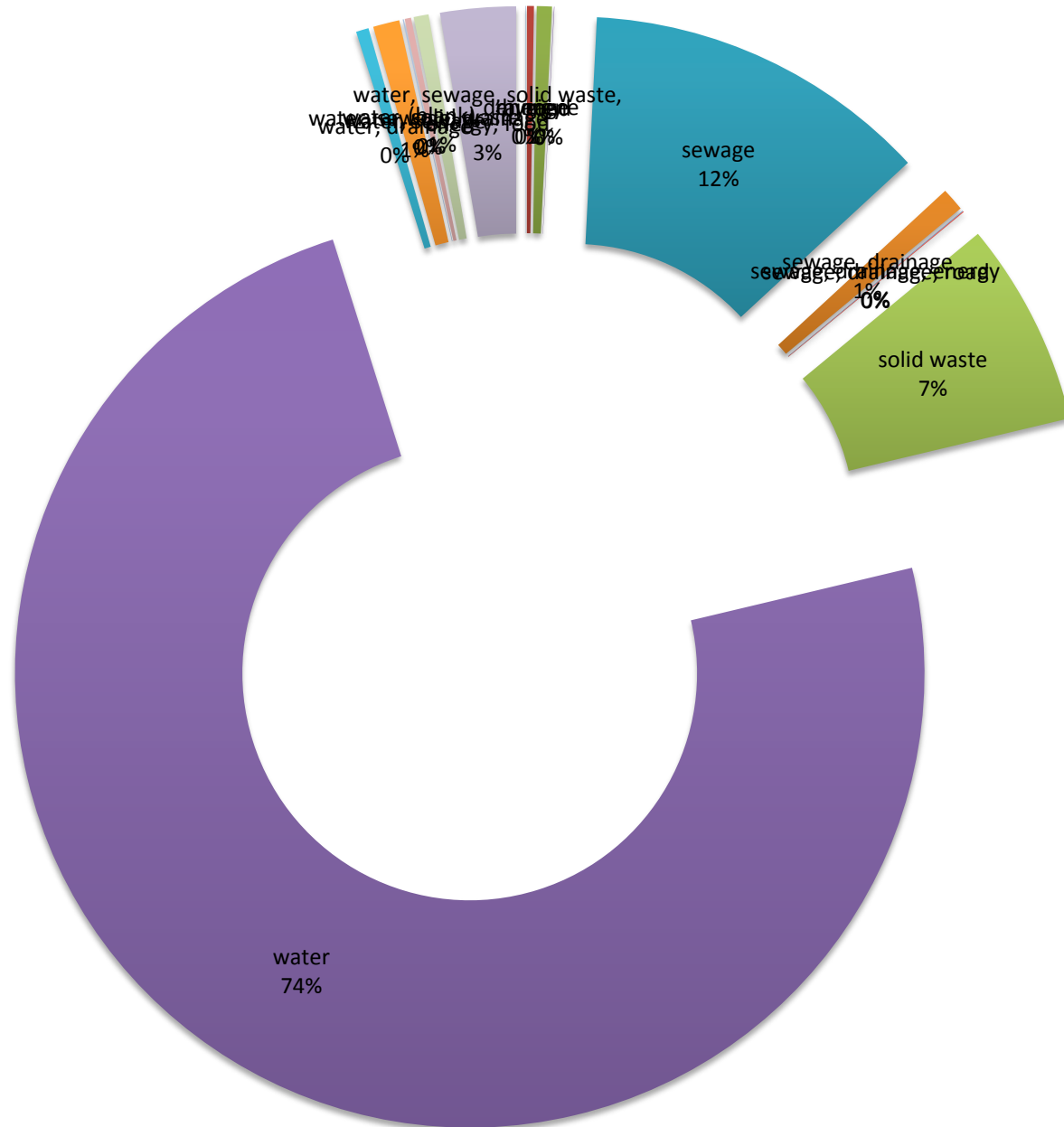
- Live document – continually being updated

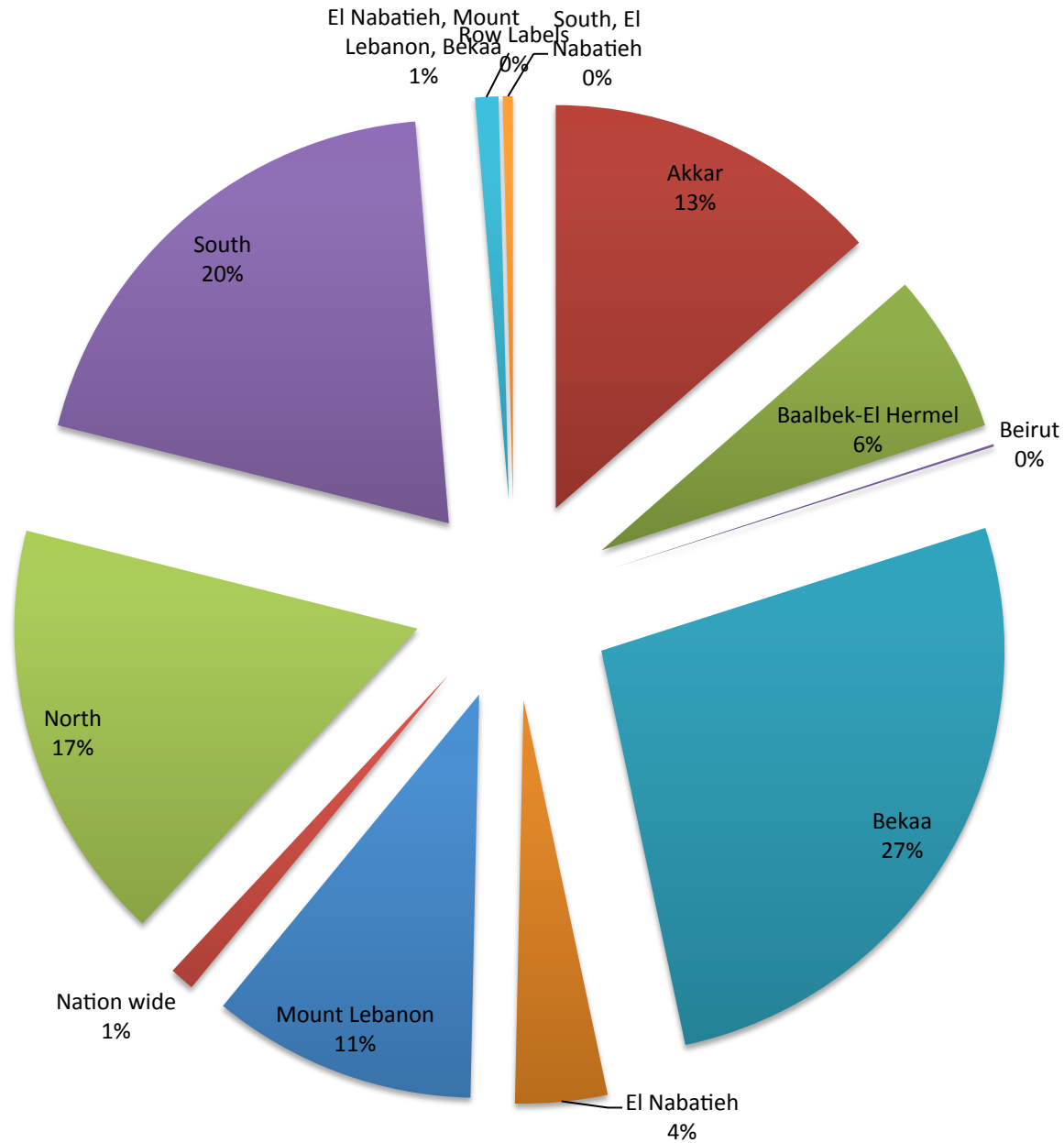
# Donors (% of funding)

# Stabilisation implementors meeting (18Mar)

- Variety of stakeholders (UN, INGO, LNGO, SISSAF/GoL) participated
- Open discussion covering:
  - progress, planning, standards, baseline data, approvals, institutional support, etc.
  - a diverse range of projects for water, wastewater, solid waste in a range of contexts from Informal Settlements to Palestinian Camps to Cities and rural areas.

# Outcomes of meeting:

- Key themes:
  - Supporting development and sharing of better baseline information
  - Sustainability of interventions/projects (cost recovery, etc.)
  - Treatment of wastewater(do/don't?, how to do better)
  - Approach/technical standards for different types of work
- Way forward:
  - Agreed to form technical groups; one each for water, wastewater and solid waste
  - Groups to address key themes or issues relevant to each sub-sector
  - Groups to be a forum for various stakeholders (Government, humanitarian/stabilisation/development agencies, private industry, etc.)

# Evictions Update

- Bekaa 20 new informal sites set up during the past 3 weeks.
- Mainly due to LAF eviction from their original sites located nearby military installation or check points.
- Coordinating with partners for need assessment and response.
- Shelter repairing kit distributions are ongoing
- WASH needs are also being identified
- Challenges remain whether concerned municipality/LAF will allow these sites to be established permanently or subject to further eviction.
