Mercy	The borehole is waiting on ministry of health approval for distribution of water for consumption.						
Corps	Unicef is in process of getting electricity connection for B.H#3 to avoid extraction of water through						
	generator which is very costly.						
	 Base course has been laid in borehole vicinity and the fence around the borehole is nearly completed. 						
	B.H should be operational by the first of April 2015.						
	Unicef is in the process of hiring a consultant for ground water monitoring study in Jordan.

	 Agreed that following the next WASH meeting, there will be a visit with partners to the waste water treatment plant. 						
	 Propose that a WASH centre in District 1 is turned into a communal garden. A small opinion survey in the affected population shows that the majority would agree with the project. 100 refugees were ask about the questions about the transformation of a public WASH block into a garden, out of 100, 93 refugees showed satisfaction on conversion of WASH block into public garden. 						
	Would like to clarify Bab Alamood focal points for boreholes 1 and 2.						
	Waste water meetings on the 2 nd and 4 th March. 2 nd March - "waste water implementation planning";						
	4 th March - presentation on the final sewage network by ACE consultant. Invitations for meetings have been sent to relevant partners.						
	Would like a Dalal septic tank for a WASH centre in District 1. UNICEF and partners to check their storage.						
	A septic tank behind the Saudi school in district 5 collapsed due to structural deficiencies. ACTED has						
	two 10m ³ reinforced tanks that JEN can use to replace the broken ones.						
	Sent proposal for renumbering the WASH blocks and have received feedback from JEN. Will move forward by consulting camp planning.						
	Faced some problems with the water supply during the storm, slightly caused by problems with internal boreholes						
	Acted is working on new water supply distribution quantities and water distribution plan to be						

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Oxfam	completed by next week (Action Point). Need to discuss with UNHCR about whether population figures shall be taken from UNHCR official registration or REACH's population count. For future plan, a discussion with UNICEF to calculate the seasonal water is needed. ACTED is planning to build absolution blocks for the masjids and want to plant trees to address the waste water. Acted will check with Alfonso (UNHCR) if there is any organization distributing/planting trees in the camp. (Action Point) Acted to have a meeting about private truck and SRAD checking entry in the camp (Action Point) Continuing campaigns that plan for community mobilization. Oxfam will be running activities to celebrate world women's day on 8th March 2015. Currently installing hand washing facilities in the markets and other public places. For public health engineering new tanks have been installed in District 7 at borehole#3. Oxfam is following up on WASH block damage due to the storm Rehabilitation of WASH blocks in D8-D7 (around 60 wash blocks) WASH committee guidelines – first getting the response to the communities and then other partners. The guidelines document will be shared before the next meeting to receive feedback from partners

	discussed at the CFW working group – JEN will attend the next CFW working group meeting to gage the
	community response to their proposal (Action Point).
