



Arrivals and Departures: The UNHCR Winter Operations Cell has developed an analytical correlation model to statistically estimate the number of arrivals to Lesbos. While this remains in testing phase, it considers variables such as sea states and related weather conditions. Yesterday, the estimate projected was approximately 1,000 less than the actual number of arrivals. EU border agency, Frontex, reported that some 900 refugees and migrants were rescued near Lesbos between the port of Mytilene and the Turkish coast.

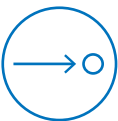
Condition of People: 103 people were voluntarily repatriated from Finland to Iraq, accompanied by dozens of Finnish police. Most had cancelled their asylum applications.

In Canakkale, Turkey, the media reported 186 refugees and migrants were arrested while attempting to travel to Greece. At least 91 were of Syrian nationality.

In Sid, Serbia, a group of refugees and migrants, who were returned from Slovenia or Croatia two days ago, protested for not being able to continue their journey towards the EU causing a halt in train transportation. As an alternative, refugees and migrants were transported from Serbia to Croatia by buses instead of by train.

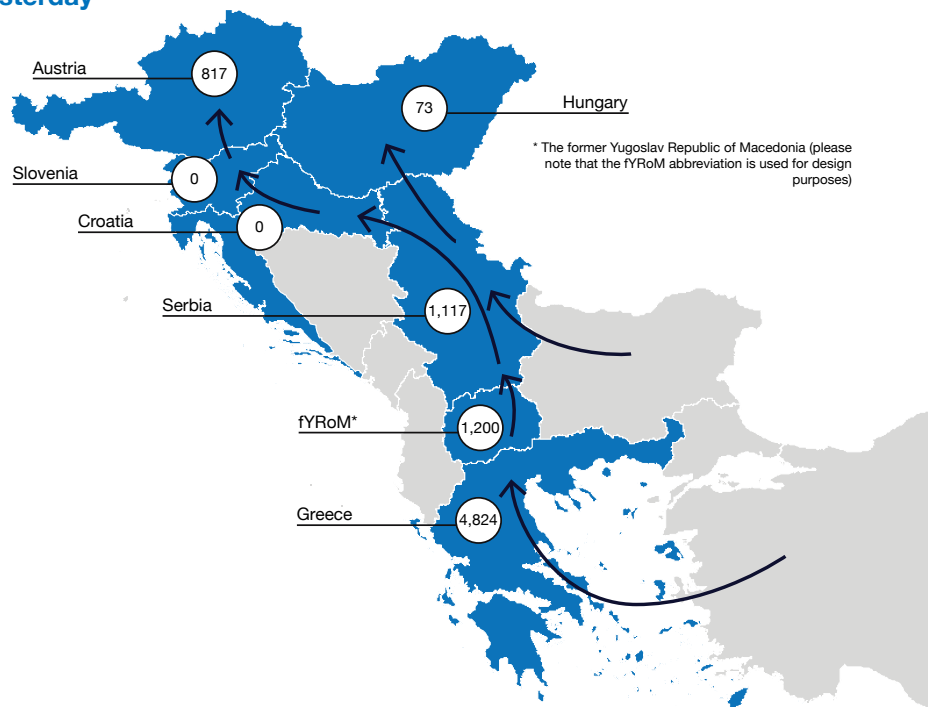
On the Greek Islands, as four hotspot facilities recently became functional, challenges in the registration process and allocation of roles were resulting in extending waiting periods. UNHCR and partners provided support to authorities in flow management, transportation, accommodation and additional equipment.

Critical Developments

During the summit held in Brussels, European leaders emphasised the importance of the implementation of the EU-Turkey Action Plan as a key component of responding to the refugee and migrant crisis. European Council President, Donald Tusk, set another summit to be held in early March with Turkey's participation. In addition, European leaders consider it necessary to now put in place the capacity for the EU to provide humanitarian assistance within the EU, in cooperation with organisations such as UNHCR, to support countries facing large numbers of refugees and migrants.

European Commissioner for Migration, Home Affairs and Citizenship, Dimitris Avramopoulos, told the Austrian government that its decision to instate daily caps to arrivals is illegal and "plainly incompatible with Austria's obligations" under EU and international law. EU officials fear Austria's move could create a domino effect along the Western Balkan route. Full Council conclusions on Migration available [here](#).

Police chiefs from the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Serbia, Croatia, Slovenia and Austria

agreed to introduce joint registration of refugees crossing from Greece into Macedonia. UNHCR considers that the Statement on border control measures issued in Zagreb on 18 February by the Heads of these Police Services not to be in line with previous positions and commitments taken by these countries and has formally requested an official response by the Government Authorities.

The first Steering Committee meeting of the Facility for Refugees in Turkey was held in Brussels, chaired by the European Commission. The first projects to provide humanitarian aid and support access to education of refugee children in Turkey will shortly

be presented for approval by the appropriate committees.

Weather Headlines

- Very unsettled weather is expected around Greece, southern Serbia and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia this weekend with strong winds and heavy rain showers or thunderstorms.

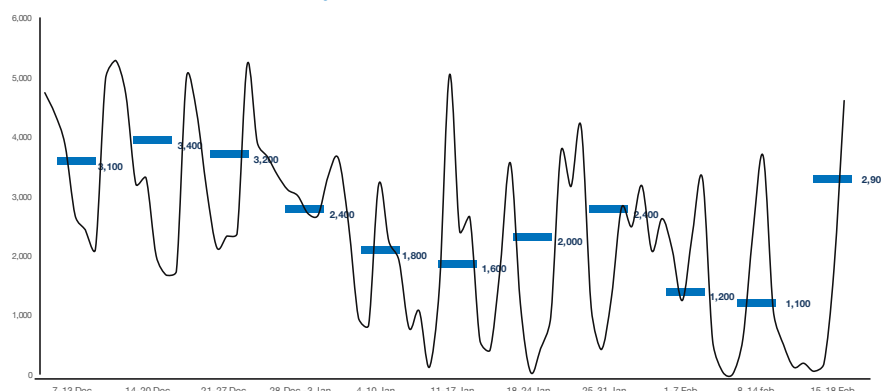
Frontex also posted a [video](#) on YouTube explaining the methods by which smugglers manage to attract and persuade refugees and migrants to depart from Turkey and travel to the Greek Islands from where they can then find routes to Western Europe. The video explains how the smugglers use social media as platforms to advertise 'travel packages' which can range from rubber dinghies to planes.

Regarding the EU Summit, German Chancellor, Angela Merkel stated on 17 February that talks with Turkey regarding the securing of borders and the return of refugees to Turkey was the most important element in the summit's strategy.

Key locations crossed by refugees

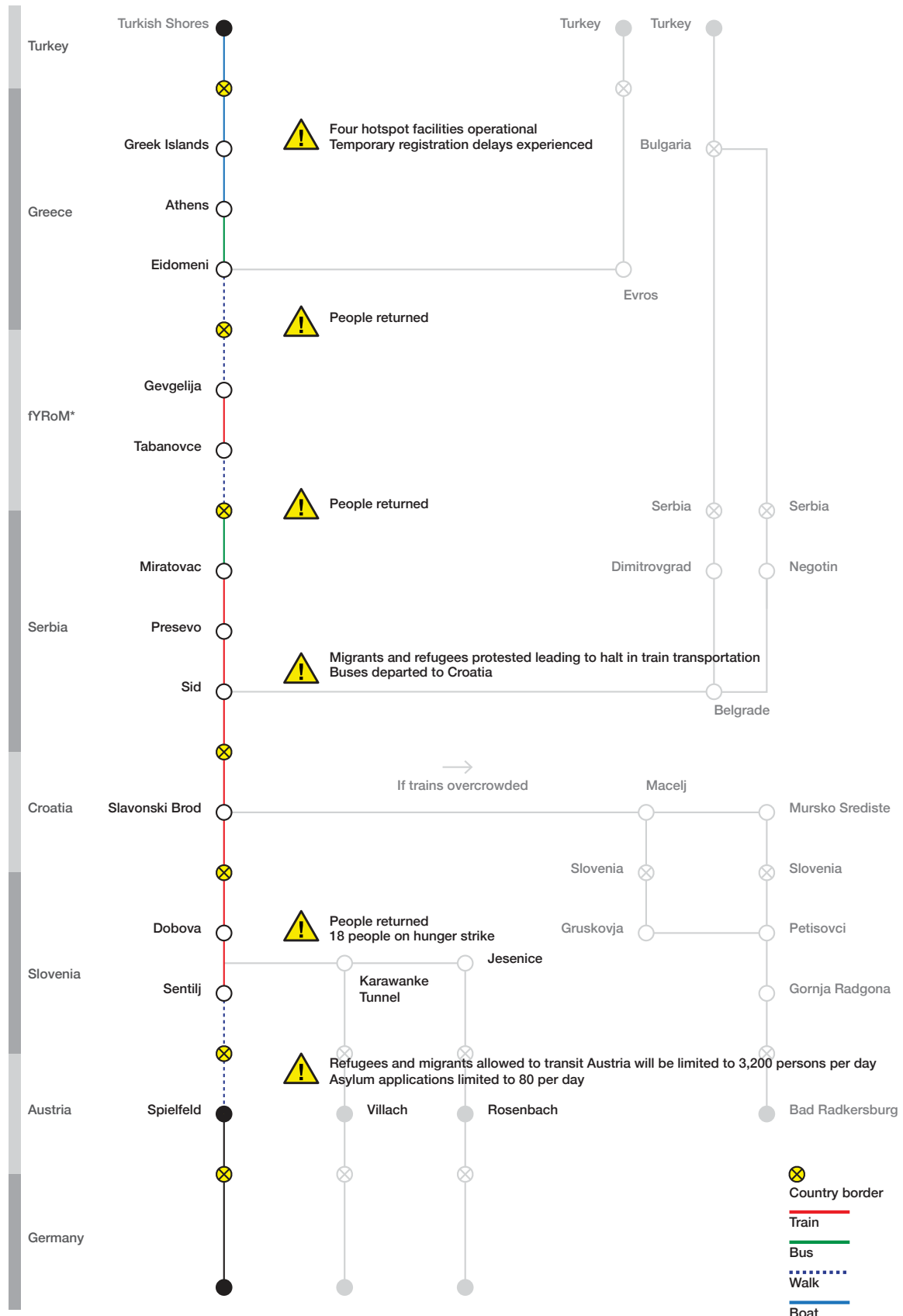


Weather Assessment

- A weather system moves across the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and then across the Aegean on Saturday and Sunday bringing some heavy showers and thunderstorms to the area. Around this weather system there will be areas of strong winds on Saturday and Sunday. It will also feel very cold for those exposed to these conditions.
- Due to the strong winds, some moderate or large waves will form in the Aegean between the Greek Islands and Turkey on Saturday night and Sunday morning. The waves can make travel by small boats difficult. In the past, a reduction in numbers of arrivals to the islands was observed with the presence of rough seas.
- Temperatures will return close to average for the time of year so it will feel far colder than it was earlier this week.

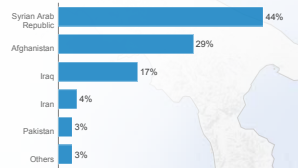

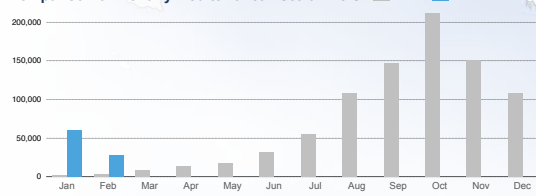

Following the humanitarian crisis in Europe: Estimated daily arrivals



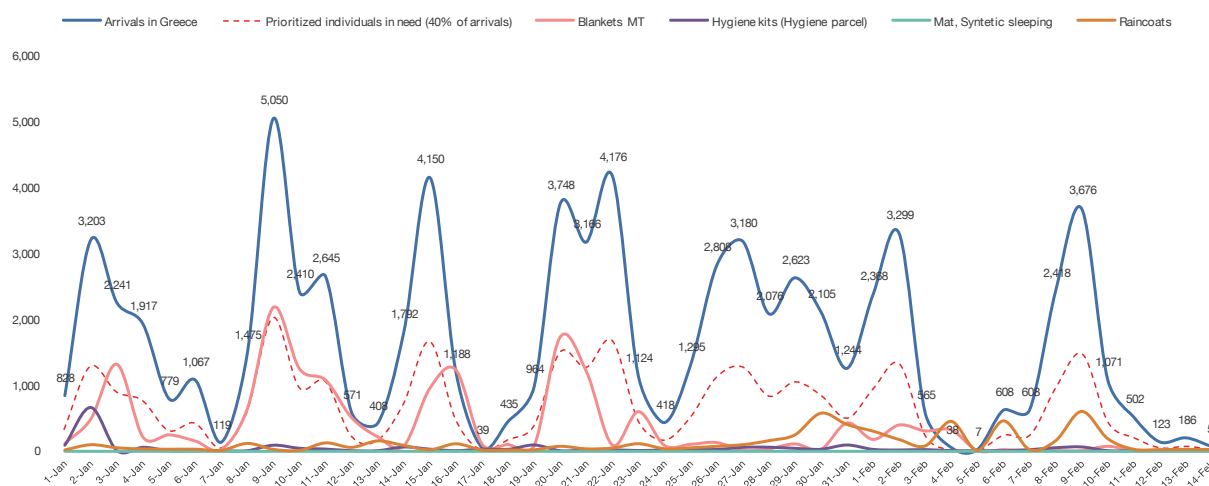
