**33,478**

100% of the refugees have been registered. As of end of July 2014, the total number of People of Concern was 33,478.

UNHCR, jointly with the Government, has secured the three camps where 23,501 refugees are settled, by maintaining their civilian and humanitarian character.

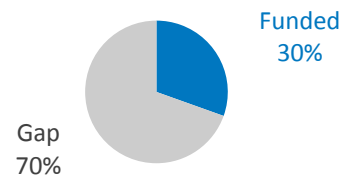

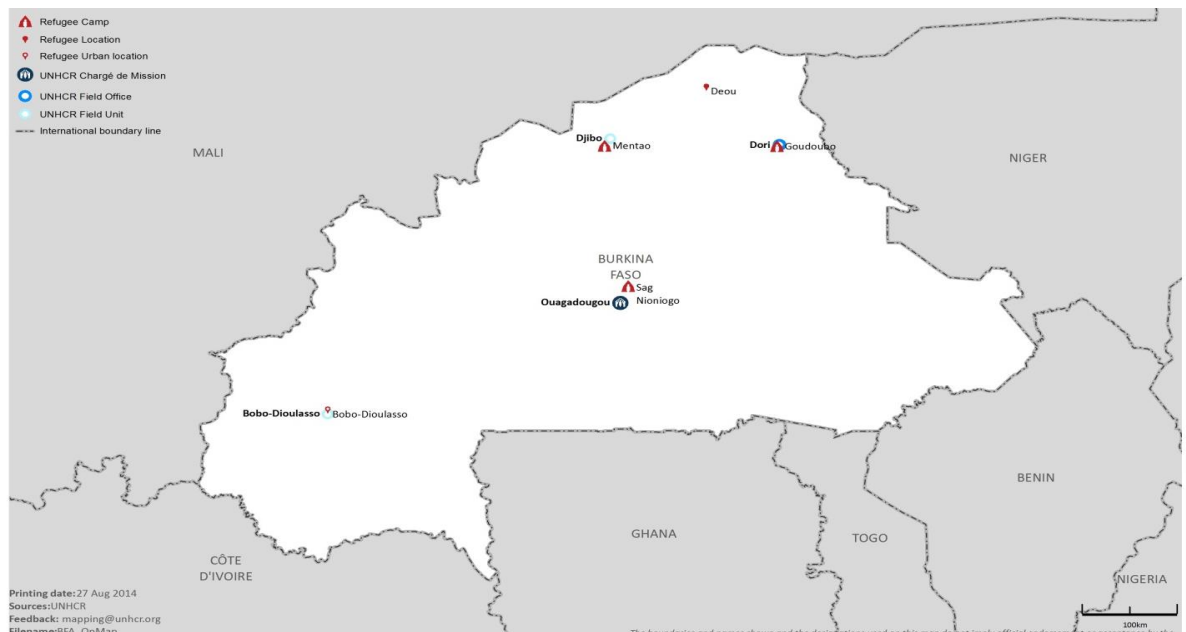

## WORKING WITH PARTNERS

- UNHCR ensures the international protection of refugees and coordinates the response of assistance jointly with CONAREF (*Commission Nationale pour les Refugies*) and with operational and implementing partners.
- UNHCR current partners are:  
**Christian Relief and Development Organization (CREDO)**: for non-Malian, urban refugees | **International Emergency and Development Aid (IEDA)**: Camp management and food aid | **HELP Germany**: firewood distribution and collection, environment preservation generally | **Médecins du Monde (MDM) – France**: Health and nutrition (Soum); \* note that since July, this partner has been using its own financial resources in the implementation of its interventions. **OXFAM**: water and sanitation in sahel camps | **Plan Burkina**: education | **Vétérinaires Sans Frontières (VSF)**: animal health and animal husbandry | **Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC)**: shelter strategy | **HELP Germany**: projects for host population | **AIRD**: warehouse management and stock control | **Danish Refugee Council (DRC)**: border monitoring and peaceful co-existence with host population |
- Partnership with other UN agencies : **WFP** for supply of food commodities | **UNFPA** for SGBV and Family Planning | **UNICEF** for Child Protection and Education | **WHO** for Health.

## MAIN ACTIVITIES

### Protection

- 100% of the refugees were registered and at the end of July 2014, the total number of refugees was 33,025.
- UNHCR jointly with CONAREF assured the security of the three camps.
- 7,012 households were provided with shelters.
- 36 boreholes with pumps were maintained to help provide each refugee with 21l of potable water per day.

### Education

- 2905 of school-age children benefited from free enrollment and follow-up in primary school.
- 76% of the children of preschool age attended playpens.
- 234 children got enrolled in high school and received free school items and 71 received grants.
- Some additional classes were built to reduce the ratio of pupils to classes.

### Health

- Effective access to primary health care services for refugees
- 5 health care centers available for necessary referral cases (618 cases indeed)
- Effective Contingency plan which helps provide appropriate response in case of epidemic outbreak

### Food Security and Nutrition

- An average of 31,114 refugees per month benefited from the food retailing (97% of total refugees).

### Water and Sanitation

- 3 new boreholes added to the 36 rehabilitated ones provide an average of 20.93 liters of potable water per person per day.
- 31 active water management committees have contributed to behavior change.
- 177 household latrines were built in addition to 1732 existing ones; which helped improve hygiene and the quality of live.
- 21 waste holes and 516 garbage cans were provided; this helped improve hygiene and sanitation

## Shelter and NFIs

- 273 households were provided with resistant shelters.
- 1,718 kits containing shelter materials and tools helped renovate 1,718 households and protect them from climate hazards.

## Camp Coordination and Camp Management

- Each of the 3 consolidated camps has an elected camp Manager and an Administrator.
- A framework document available for all partners working in the camps.
- Successful community sensitization activities for environment protection, hygiene, etc.

## Access to Energy

- 4697 households use renewable energy.
- Promotion of energy saving practices
- Development of a strategy for the promotion of the use of sustainable energy in the camps.

## Community Empowerment and Self-Reliance

- 175 income generating activities were financed to increase the income of the beneficiaries and make women financially less dependent on men.
- 27,296 animals were vaccinated and 387 tonnes of animal food were distributed.
- Tonnes of millet, cowpea and sesame were distributed to 2,200 households, improving their living conditions and self-reliance.
- 1,793 refugees were trained as to the management of income generating activities and 336 were trained in association management.

## Durable Solutions

- 3 new boreholes and 7 rehabilitated in favor of the host community.
- 2200 households from 28 villages of the Sahel were supported with millet, cowpea and sesame for agriculture.
- Animal health care and animal food were provided in support to the host community.
- Some lands were restored, prepared for more productive agriculture.

## Logistics

- All 128 vehicles are still in good condition
- The 2 officials warehouses (Ouagadougou and Dori) were kept in good repair and helped provide efficient respond to any issue of stocking.
