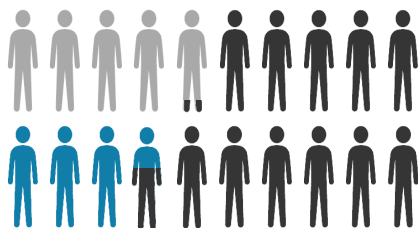

- UNHCR and IOM are implementing joint profiling exercise of IDPs.
- The joint UNHCR/OCHA mission spent several days with members of sector groups, partners, and the government
- Extension of the camp ongoing

PRIORITIES

- Increase response capacity for access to basic services for refugees to meet international standards
- Ensure timely identification, referral of and follow up on protection cases
- Establish community IDP profiles anchored in a protection analysis
- Provide assistance and protection to IDPs and host communities through “one-stop shops” and community-based protection mechanisms



538 birth certificates issued to new born in Minawao in order to prevent Statelessness. Donation of 40 registers to Mokolo civil status registration centre to assist in birth and marriage and marriage certificates issuance.



Psychosocial support need to be increased. Referral capacity of district hospital needs to be increased; health staffing to increase; Cholera prevention needs to be intensified.



Food basket for rations since October not complete; delays in food distribution due to pipeline issues



Standards in camp not yet reached; efforts ongoing, but more funding required. UNHCR to build 10 new boreholes in the camp and another 10 in host villages around the camp



2,681 family shelters built out of which more than 300 by the refugees themselves; 1,068 family tents and more than 170 community shelter established where more than 5,000 refugees live.



Out of 16,496 school-aged children (from preschool to secondary), 8,340 are enrolled in primary and secondary education; there is currently no pre-school activities



Over 2,795 women and men including from host communities will benefit in 2015 from livelihood activities/vocational training
