Contextual Background

Pattern in Population Change

- Influx of refugees between 7 May and 7 June 2013 resulted from the war between the opposition group and the government led to the establishment of Okugo Refugee Camp.
- 1,238 new arrival from South Sudan have been registered in Okugo from January to July 2016.

Areas of Origin

- 99.1% of the refugees in Okugo came from South Sudan, Jonglie state, 0.3% from Upper Nile state and the remaining 0.6% from other South Sudan states
- The main ethnic groups are Agnuak (53.2%), Murle(42.5%) and others(4.3%)

Cultural Background

Administrative Structure

- UNHCR provides Protection, Community Services and Logistics, distribution of sanitary materials and monitors delivery of services.
- Camp Management and Coordination, the implementation of Primary Healthcare, distribution of Food and Core Relief Items, Provision and Refugee nationality screening/ Registration is provided by Ethiopia's governmental body, the Administration for Refugee and Returnee Affairs (ARRA) with support from UNHCR.
- Camp Coordination Meetings are held monthly between UNHCR, ARRA and partners on the last Thursday of the fourth weeks of the month. The meeting is co-chaired by UNHCR and ARRA.
- UN Agency (WFP) and Partners (DRC, RaDO, NRDEP, and DICAC) work together with ARRA and UNHCR in the provision of various essential services.
- Monthly child protection and SGBV taskforces chaired by ARRA and UNHCR is held to coordinate the activities of implementing partners
- The Refugee Central Committee is consulted on multi-sectorial issues pertaining to the camp life

Operations and Services

- Refugees are individually registered in UNHCR's progress database. Their finger prints and photograph is captured and recorded to avoid double registration. Refugees are provided ration cards and proof of registration. Ration card numbers and household registration numbers are used for identification, distributions and for referrals between partners.
- Food distribution is undertaken by ARRA on the first two weeks of every month. A refugee get 13kg of wheat, 1.5 kg of pulses, 0.9 kg of oil, 1.5 kg, 0.45 kg of sugar, and 0.15 kg of salt. But sugar is no longer provided.
- Refugees receive **CRIs** such as sleeping mats, blankets, jerry cans, kitchen sets, buckets, soap, mosquito nets, and hand-held solar lanterns while in the camp.
- There are 21 water points (with 125 taps) in the camp. The refugees get 18 liters water per person per day. The average distance between the existing water points is 200meter.
- ARRA is running the health center in the refugee camp. Cases are also referred from ARRA health center to Aman general hospital, Jimma hospital and to Addis Ababa.
- Core protection activities include SGBV prevention and response, child protection, youth protection, addressing the needs of refugees with specific needs, trainings for the refugee community is ongoing.
- There are 2 emergency education centers in Okugo. The emergency education centers give service for students between grades 1 – 4. The construction of primary school by ARRA is completed. Students in emergency school have moved to permanent school building. 51 refugees are attending class in Dimma Secondary School.
- Refugee Central Committee (RCC) – Is a resident coordination and leadership body. It is made up of a Chairman, Representatives for Specific Needs (Child Protection, Women, and Persons with Disabilities), representatives from each Zone and representatives from different ethnic group. Committee members are elected by camp residents. There is also Women Association, Child clubs and youth committee
- Refugee Security Committee (“Shurtas”) – is responsible for crowd control and overall conflict management in the camp. ARRA is responsible for the camp security and closely monitor the functioning of the shurtas.
