# EMERGENCY UPDATE ON THE SOUTH SUDAN REFUGEE SITUATION

## HIGHLIGHTS

- **The number of people crossing in to Uganda at border points is steadily declining in comparison with previous weeks.** Yesterday, 400 refugees were reported in Elegu Collection Point (Adjumani), while 362 refugees crossed in Oraba (Arua axis), 60 in Lamwo and 11 in Moyo. 941 refugees were received at Kiryandongo Reception Centre though there is a possibility that some refugees at Kiryandongo may have come from other temporary reception facilities in Uganda with their own transport.
- Kiryandongo refugee settlement in Mid-West Uganda has reached its maximum capacity of around 60,000 refugees. Today, it was decided that the reception centre at the settlement will be closed by the end of this week. As of next week, any new refugee arrivals in Kiryandongo will be transported to Bidbidi settlement in Yumbe.
- Security has reportedly been reinforced in Juba, as well as other parts of the country. There are increasing reports of fighting taking place between government forces and rebel troops outside the capital. Robberies, sexual assaults and killings are alleged to be on the rise in Jonglei State.
- 739 refugees were transferred to the new Bidibidi settlement area in Yumbe district, bringing the total number located there to 5,330.
- 10 cases of moderate malnutrition and 5 cases of acute malnutrition were identified in Nyumanzi Transit Centre from 01 to 07 August 2016, indicating that malnutrition remains within emergency standard levels. Food supplementary programmes are being implemented to bring those identified back to health.
- The availability of clean water at Nyumanzi Transit Centre is at 11.17 litres per person per day, below the emergency standard of 15 litres per person per day. Another borehole has been drilled and water systems are being extended to reach available taps and distribution points in order to increase the water supply.

## UPDATE ON SITUATION

### Operational Update

- In Yumbe, an average of 280 consultations are taking place each day. 45% of those are to members of the local host population. Malaria and respiratory tract infections are the leading cause of illness. Cholera preparedness measures have been reinforced following reports of an outbreak in Juba.

### Transit and Reception Centres

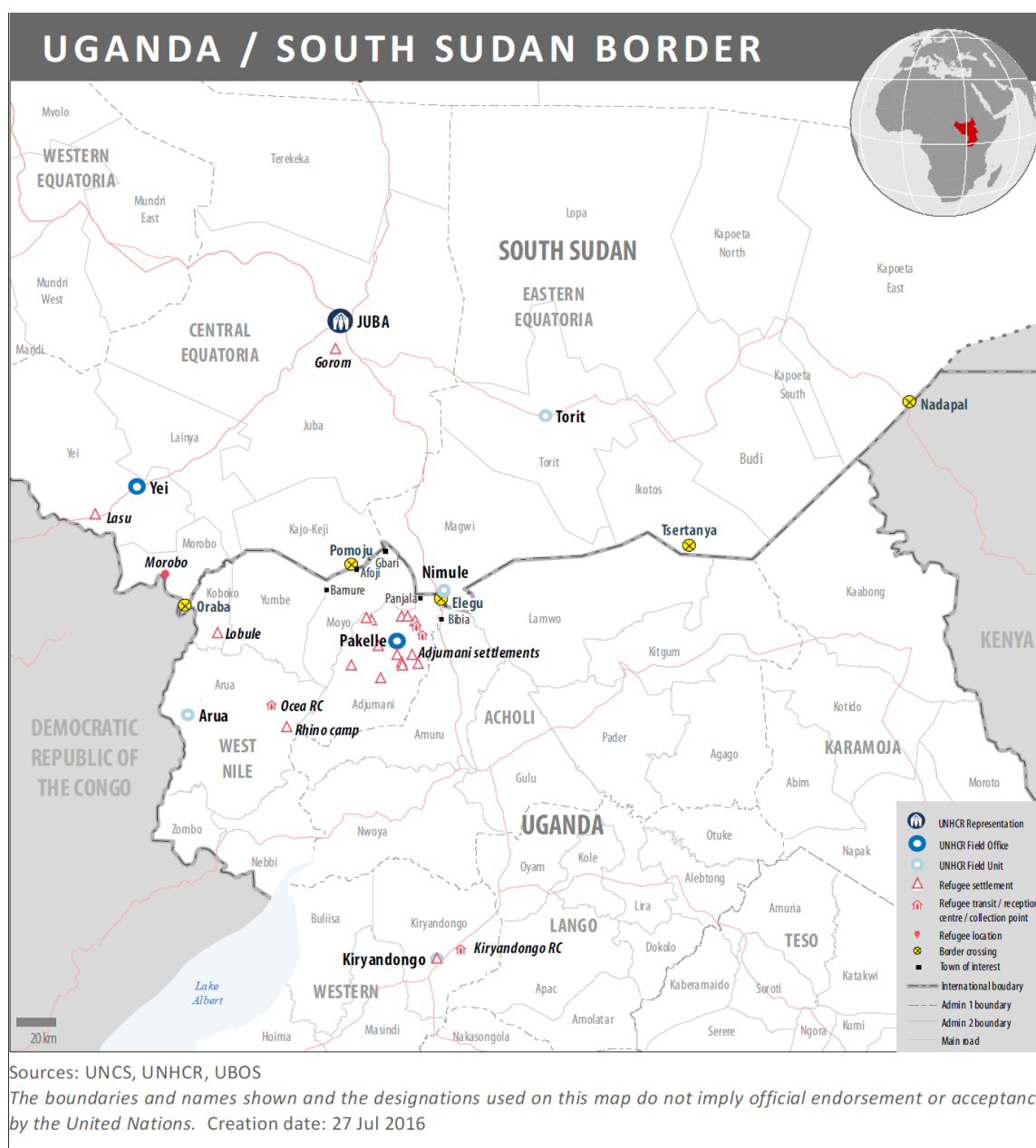
- 200 refugees spent the night at Elegu Collection Point, which has the capacity for 1,000 refugees. 1,429 refugees are staying at Kuluba Collection Point which has the capacity for 400 refugees.
- 13,875 refugees are currently staying at Nyumanzi Transit Centre, which has the capacity to accommodate 3,500 refugees. Similarly, 2,606 refugees have been staying at Ocea Transit Centre, which has the capacity for 500 refugees with added temporary structures. Likewise, 28,963 refugees are staying at Pagirinya I and II reception centres which is far beyond the capacity of these centres. 2,941 individuals spent the night at the Kiryandongo Reception Centre, over three times higher than its capacity of 700 individuals.

### Response Update

- Community groups are being set up and mobilized at reception facilities in order to raise awareness about sexual and gender-based violence and mechanisms through which it can be reported. 38 volunteers were trained on UNHCR's Code of Conduct and available SGBV prevention tools, including the referral pathways, strategy and incident report forms. 1,150 solar lanterns were distributed to 1,150 families which will help to reduce protection risks that refugee face because of absence of lights.

### Critical Needs

- There is a need to construct specific shelter for persons with specific protection needs in Pagirinya settlement. The construction process has not yet started as it remains pending the approval of a new design. This is expected to be provided in the coming days.
- Stocks of medicines for treating malaria and respiratory tract infections are beginning to be depleted due to the high number of refugees reporting from such illnesses.

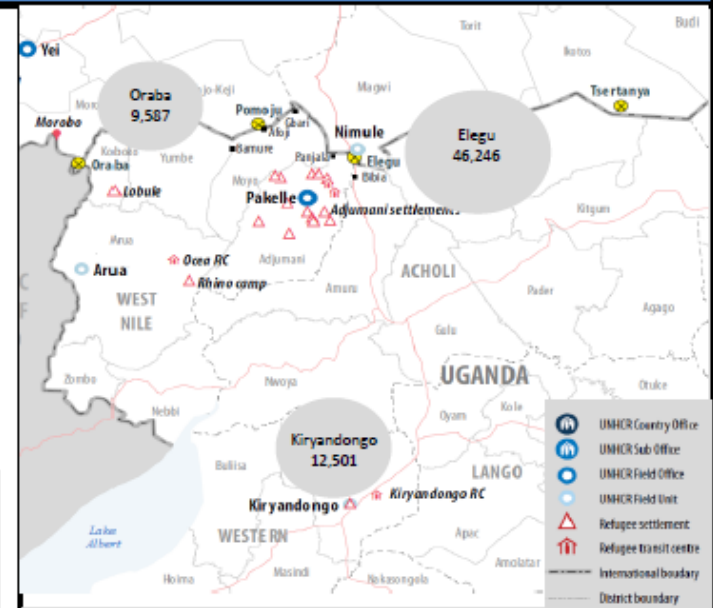

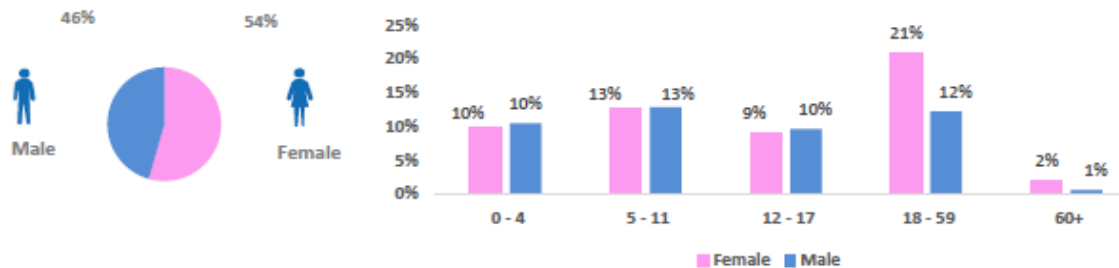

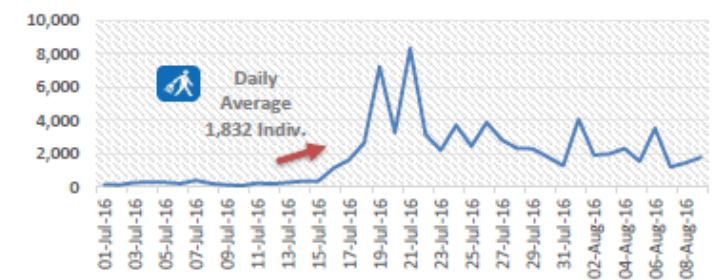

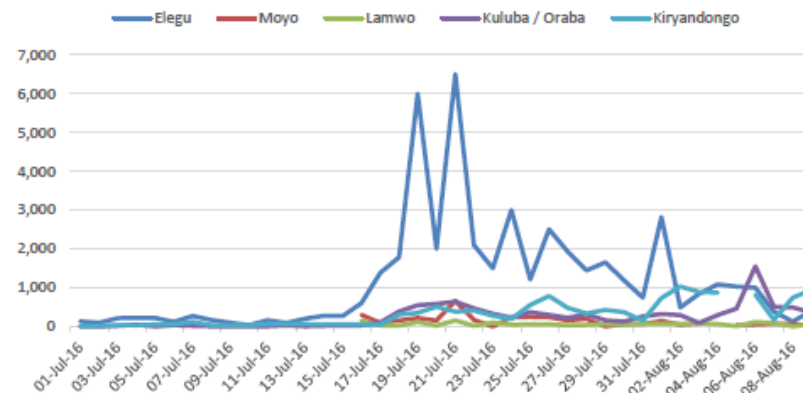
