## 1. Status of Gender Analysis by Sector (Follow-up to the action points)

See attached the one-pager showing the current status of gender analysis.

Additions provided by participants:

Health: mental health analysis to be included by end September

WASH: feedback waiting from Sector Coordinators

Shelter: continued support for gender analysis

Livelihoods: four task forces formed; two-day UN livelihoods workshop to be organized

Basic Needs: team for gender analysis formed; collaborated with Livelihoods Sector

Protection: another meeting scheduled; while ActivityInfo to be used for analysis, challenges for analysis for protection and SGBV groups still remain; further discussion for a way forward

Education: advocate for informing JRP Education Sector response document

## 2. Updates from Sectors

Health: Gender Marker training conducted

Reproductive Health: a group to encourage men and boys involvement in Reproductive Health to be reactivated

Livelihoods: Gender Marker training to be organized

Education: Gender Marker training conducted

## 3. Pilot process for new IASC Gender and Age Marker (Education, WASH and Health)

Identification of participating agencies almost completed. A meeting for the pilot process is merged to SGFP meeting. All three sectors will start the process soon to continue for another two months.

## 4. Updates from Inter-Sector Working Group

- The Jordan Humanitarian Fund's next call for the proposal is scheduled in mid-September. The Inter-Sector Working Group has prepared the sector priorities document to be used for the next Jordan Humanitarian Fund call for proposal scheduled in September. The sector priorities documents are available at <http://data.unhcr.org/syrianrefugees/download.php?id=11659> Gender focal points are expected to support Sector Coordinators for screening proposals in terms of gender sensitivity.
  - a. Action Point: Simon to discuss with OCHA on additions to the JHF score sheet to clearly mention Gender Marker rating.
- The preparation for the Jordan Response Plan 2017 – 2019 officially started on 14 August. This year a JRP Task Force for Livelihoods became a stand-alone sector. JRP Task Forces began to meet to update the Comprehensive Vulnerability Assessment and to discuss their respective sector responses and projects for 2017 – 2019.
