Informal Tented Settlements - ITSs Presentation (ACTED & INTERSOS).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - ACTED and INTERSOS presented their intervention in the informal tented settlement (ITSs). The ITSs definition is applied to residential areas where groups of housing units are constructed on a land where the occupants have no legal rights or claim and where this situation is considered to be against the housing regulations. - 16,060 individual are estimated to be living in ITSs in Jordan, with the majority residing in Mafraq, Irbid and Balqa governorates. - The delivery of the humanitarian assistance to ITSs is considered to be minimal and limited due to the regular seasonal movement of the ITSs occupants and their preference to locate on a "hard to access" geographical locations. - The type of assistance provided in ITSs are mainly winterization cash assistance, regular cash assistance in addition to protection interventions.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Security concerns, legal documentation, health services, food consumption, hygiene and harsh weather condition are considered to be the major challenges for partners working in ITSs. - A technical ITSs group formed by INTERSOS, ACTED and Save the Children (the current humanitarian actors in the ITSs context) coordinates their interventions and prevents overlap and duplication in services through the use of Bayanati (a database led by UNICEF). - For further info on the presentation please follow the link: http://data.unhcr.org/syrianrefugees/working_group.php?Page=Country&LocationId=107&Id=67
<p>Winterization Dashboard</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The winterization dashboard that reflects the urban winterization intervention as of 3 Nov was presented to the task force members. <p>MoPIC approvals</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The feedback received from MoPIC following the first letter submitted by end of Oct was shared with the task force members bilaterally. - The task force members agreed to send a second support letter to MoPIC by the third week of November. <p>Harsh weather conditions task force updates</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The harsh weather conditions (HWC) task force members reviewed the HWC guideline document. The triggers for the Alert system codes (Red, Orange and Yellow) were discussed and the definition of what is consider as harsh weather per to the geographical location will feed into the categorization of the alert system. - It was agreed in the HWC meeting to reach out to the winterization task force in order to identify NGOs willing to provide logistic support of distribution during harsh weather condition. Willing NGOs are encouraged to contact the winterization task force chairs. - The HWC guideline document will be shared with the winterization task force members when the first draft is finalized.
