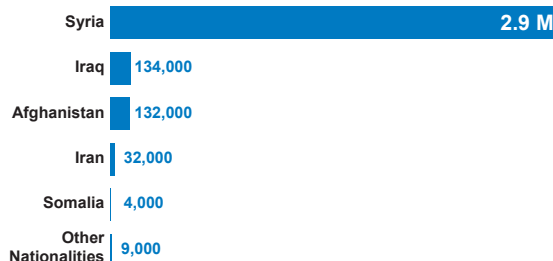

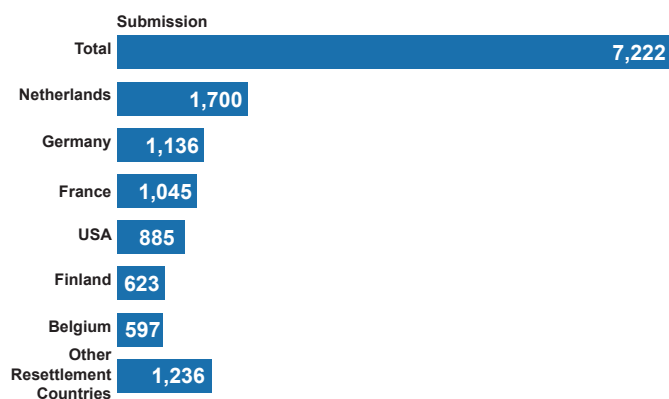

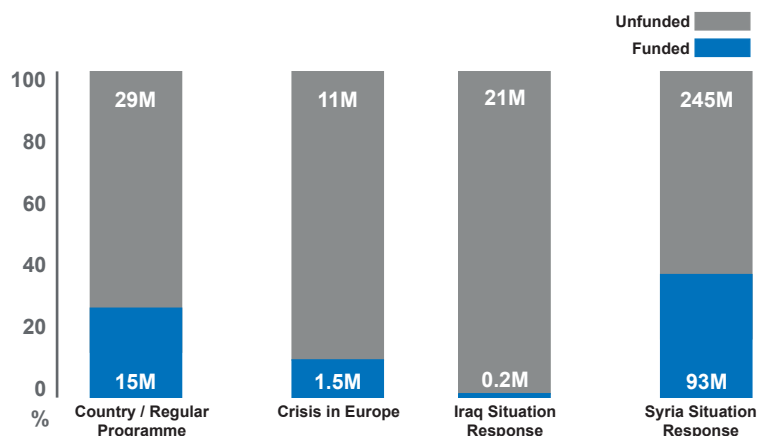

## Protection



**Around 1,200**

Officials and humanitarians trained by UNHCR on international protection so far in 2017.

**Around 3,300**

Non-Syrians with specific needs were identified by UNHCR and referred for further assistance in 2017.

**Over 11,000**

Persons of concern received counselling from the UNHCR-ASAM Counselling Line since it opened in March 2017.

**Close to 600**

Unaccompanied and separated children have registered with UNHCR so far in 2017.

## RSD



**Around 310,000**

Non-Syrian Refugees and Asylum-Seekers registered with UNHCR at end of April 2017.

**Around 7,000**

RSD decisions by UNHCR since 1 January 2017, as well as more than 20,000 decisions in 2016.

**Around 2,000**

Total decisions were made by UNHCR in April 2017.

## Resettlement



**Around 47,300**

Refugees are at various stages of the resettlement process so far in 2017.

Syrian Refugees have been assessed for resettlement in the course of 2017.

**Close to 6,000**

Refugees counselled on queries related to resettlement so far in 2017.

## Urban Outreach

Outreach missions were undertaken to camps and urban locations since the beginning of the year.

## Livelihoods
