<p>Shelter UNHCR</p>	<p>UNHCR and CMAs have undertaken with the Government counterpart discussions on shelter repair and maintenance solutions based on the most updated shelter assessment done in Sittwe camps by the Government. The assessments have highlighted the need implement rapid repair and maintenance prior to rainy season. As discussions are still ongoing, further information will be shared once agreement is made.</p>
<p>Non Food Items UNHCR-DRC</p>	<p>Following the Government's decision, the NFI distribution is going to take place on May 6 and it will cover 1,441 HHs. Post-distribution monitoring is already planned for the following days.</p>
<p>WASH Solidarites International</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - New referential of infrastructure has been completed - 15 latrines with concrete floor replacement have been completed - Latrine renovation activities have not been restarted yet, first round of repairs will be done starting early in May to improve access. A second round of major repairs will be conducted between end of May and June prior to rainy season. - 23 latrine pit rings considered as hazardous have been replaced, completion of cover installation expected in the beginning of May - Regular water-testing at household- and borehole-level - Latrine desludging is running normally - Regular hygiene promotion sessions at HH-level (with 2 week pause during water festival) - Regular borehole maintenance (with 2 week pause during water festival) - Regular borehole maintenance (with 2 week pause during water festival) - On-going drainage cleaning campaign - Solar lighting installation has been postponed due to water festival, installation will start early in May
