CCCM Agency - RSG, UNHCR, LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Township Immigration Department visited to discuss on the new membership/reform of the CMC on 11st August. CMC informed that, Township Immigration Department visited to camp and discussed on green card issues with CMC members and IDPs on 8th August. On 2nd August, UNHCR visited to camp participants by 3 (1 female) and discussed about camp situation with CMC. UNHCR team also visited the camp to know the situation on 10th August. Monthly regular CMC meeting was on 12th August and attended by 29 (Women 14) participants from CMC, WDG, YDG, CDG and camp based committees. UNHCR, DRC, SI and LWF conducted Protection Mainstreaming Training to the camp base staffs participated. A total of 30 (4 Women) participated the training on 25th and 26th August. Inter-Agency meeting was held on 26th August and was participated by 18 (7 women) from LWF, CMC, camp based committees, social groups, incentive workers and SCI. Opening to CRM boxes every Monday of the week. No complaints received from the box. 12 (7 girls) new born babies reported during the month. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are 84 families with 419 populations from Minbya and Myebon who do not receive food and requested for the same.

LWF facilitated regular CMC meeting on 10th August and attended by 30 (12 women) participants from CMC, Camp Based Committees, Social groups and camp incentive workers. UNHCR and US Ambassador visited the camp to observe the situation of shelters on 10th August and interacted with IDPs and CMC. Inter-Agency meeting was held on 24th August and participated by 26 (7 women) from LWF, CMC, camp based committees, social groups, incentive workers, CDN and SCI. UNICEF monitored to TLS and NFE centres on 26th August.
