Shelter UNHCR	A briefing session for the Shelter situation in Rakhine will be held by the National CCCM-Shelter-NFI Cluster on March 10 in Yangon.
Non Food Items UNHCR-DRC	The Relief and Resettlement Department of the Ministry of Social Welfare has requested UNHCR support by way of distribution of NFI to ten camps in the Sittwe township. The distribution will cover more than 10,000 households. It is planned that this distribution will start on the 17th of March.

Security and Safety	<p>It was reported by MSF team working in Sin Tat Maw (Pauktaw township) that more than 100 chickens have died during January and February, and that 4 dogs that ate the chickens also died. They found neither unusual illness nor influenza-like illness among people.</p> <p>The CCCM Agencies are closely monitoring the situation in all camps and assessing the count of livestock. However, it's highly appreciated if service providers could share with both CCCM</p>
