<b>Camp Coordination and Camp Management</b> Agency- Lutheran World Federation (LWF)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC meeting conducted on 8th October and participated by 34 (16 women) CMC members and representatives from WDG, YDG, and Disabled persons, FMCs, Elders, PTAs and Camp Incentive Workers. IDPs and camp management issues were discussed.</li> <li>• Updated 2 sets of service provider Billboard in the camp on 13th October. LWF supported furniture (one Book Shelf) and stationary for CMC office in the camp 14th October.</li> <li>• LWF supported visibility kits (Shoes) for 30 CMC (15 women) and 20 Incentive workers (9 women) on 14th October and supported Umbrellas for 30 CMC (15 women) on 27th October.</li> <li>• Inter-agency meeting was conducted on 26th October and attended by 30 (14 women) representatives from CMC, WDG, YDG, and Disabled persons, SCI, DRC, CDN and LWF. The agencies shared previous month progress, responded concerns and shared next month plan.</li> <li>• LWF conducted CMC Training on 27th October and participated by 34 (17 women) CMC members and Camp incentive workers.</li> <li>• LWF repaired CRM box on 22nd October.</li> <li>• There are 73 (35 women) people with specific needs, 184 pregnant women and 340 lactating mother.</li> <li>• 17 (5 girls) babies were born and a boy (3 years) was lost and found the dead body in the latrine pit during the month and updated population dash board.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IWs asked for staff ID card or badge of Organization to abstain from mistaken point of views at visiting for data collecting and analysing.</li> <li>• CMC submitted to repair urgently for Multipurpose in camp because it is difficulty to provide meeting and training with agencies.</li> <li>• Some CMC members are suggesting to reform the CMC in the camp for next plan.</li> </ul>

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MHAA, MRF, Plan International, Consortium of Dutch NGOs (CDN) and ACF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MHAA provided nutrition assistance for malnourished children in the camp, as its regular implementation on 2 days per week.</li> <li>• ACF provided nutrition and MHCP services 3 days/week through its Nutrition Clinic.</li> <li>• 1496 IDPs of 257 HHs received food ration (Rice, Oil, Beans, Salt and Blended food) from CDN in the OTG (1) on 19th October.</li> <li>• Plan International distributed Food ration (rice, Oil, Beans, Blended food and salt) for 1096 IDPs (225 HHs) in Ohn Taw Gyi (4, 5) camps on 22nd October and 197 Family in Baw Dhu Pha (20 LH) on 27th October.</li> <li>• MA-UK collected household and population of staying with offered food in the camp on 27th October.</li> </ul>	distributing in the camps based on 2012 IDP population list.
<b>Health</b> Agency- Mercy Malaysia	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mercy Malaysia provides Health Care service in OTG (south &amp; north). Opening hours is from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM 5 days in a week (Monday to Friday).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC and IDPs submitted to provide another clinic because it is not enough for them, there are only one clinic for OTG south and OTG north in the camp.</li> </ul>
<b>NFIs</b> Agency-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• State Government is distributed 300 packed of fuels (replacement of fire wood) in the camp on 1st October.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC requested to provide NFI Kits for All household.</li> </ul>
<b>Shelter</b> Agency - LWF	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For the sake of gales and winds, a shelter (No-61 from OTG-5) is collapsed and a baby and mother were injured on 8th October.</li> <li>• UNHCR distributed 5 set of carpenter tool kits for shelter and camp structure repair and maintenance.</li> <li>• LWF proceeded to restructure 23 shelter damaged by cyclone from AA DKH support.</li> <li>• 2225 damaged rooms repairing have to finish in this month, but that is late process because of insufficient shelter material.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC submitted to repair urgently for Multipurpose in camp because it is difficulty to provide meeting and training with agencies.</li> </ul>
<b>WASH</b> Agency- Danish Refugee Council (DRC)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• DRC distributed 2320 Hygiene Kits on 11th October and continued regular WASH activities like dislodges and camp cleaning campaign with 222 volunteers from DRC.</li> <li>• 420 Latrines of OTG (4) were 100% maintained, 113 latrines of OTG (1) and 65 latrines of Bawdupha (20HH) were 100% finished.</li> <li>• Construction of Incinerator completed on October.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• DRC mentioned that latrines were not dislodged last month due to no vehicle from Oxfam to carry the excrements.</li> </ul>
<b>Protection and Community Service</b> Agency - LWF and SCI	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• LWF supplied newspaper and magazine weekly for community library.</li> <li>• LWF conducted Indoor recreation activity of painting, weaving and cosmetic art competition for children, it was participants by 90 (60 ladies) on 5th October.</li> <li>• LWF supported Furniture for Library in the camp on 14th October.</li> <li>• Protection mainstreaming training organized jointly by UNHCR, IRC and LWF on 6th and 22nd October and participated by 30 (8 women) and 28 (13 women) respectively.</li> <li>• SCI provided supplementary food for pregnant women and lactating mother in first week of the month.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SCI field staffs transfer those women who need immediate health service to Thet Kae Pyin and Dar Paing hospital.</li> </ul>
