The distribution will cover more than 10,000 households. It is planned that this distribution will start after the HH survey ends.

The courses will take place every week at the Women Center.</li> <li>- General information sessions, and focus group discussions and all other activities are on-going.</li> </ul>

<b>Child Protection</b> SCI	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- First week of April, Forum Theatre will take place at the Child Friendly Spaces. This strong tool is used to develop a sense of trust between the facilitator and the children, so children feel safe to express issues and take part in the "theatre". The methodology allows children to present an issue that is selected by a group of children as the issue most relevant to them. By working, and presenting in a group no individual child is stigmatized as the one raising the "issue" or the "problem".</li> <li>- Child Protection group meeting on April 28 at Child Protection office.</li> </ul>
<b>Security and Safety</b>	<p>It was reported during a meeting with women group that there have been cases of chicken pox in PYG village, STMG camp, and also in OTG-N where 18 cases were confirmed by Mercy Malaysia.
