<b>Camp coordination and Camp Management</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Family survey report is under the verification process.</li> <li>CMC organized monthly meeting, with CMC women members as invitees, on December 9.</li> <li>LWF facilitated the inter agency meeting on December 24.</li> <li>CMC was trained on roles and responsibility this month.</li> <li>LWF trained fire safety volunteers and installed fire safety kits.</li> <li>LWF distributed stationary and visibility kits for CMC and Incentive workers.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The camp is prone to floods and storms and is very isolated from services and markets and the IDPs are not allowed to travel to access the same. It is a miserable place to live with sanitation issues due to a lack of proper drainage.</li> </ul>
<b>Education</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>LWF is implementing 5 TLS and 2 NFE in camp and infrastructure is under progress. Teacher training will organize in January second week.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Access to higher education is needed</li> </ul>
<b>Food</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Save the Children International is responsible for Food distribution in camp.</li> <li>Food distribution was held on 19th December 2014. It was later than expected and the IDP had difficulties to manage as a result.</li> <li>40 households (393 populations) who migrated from Ah Nauk Ywe and San Na Maw are staying in Nget</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>IDPs requested food distributions to be on time at regular intervals.</li> <li>The 40 households from Ah Nauk Ywe and San Na Maw requested to be included in the food distribution list for Nget Chaung 2</li> </ul>

So discussion with Nget Chaung 1 is to be held.</li> <li>CMC members requested the repair of bathing rooms.</li> </ul>

<b>Food</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Save the Children International is responsible for Food distribution.</li> <li>• Usually, Save the Children distributed food on the first week of the month but for this month food distribution was on 15th.</li> <li>• In the camp 106 families are not receiving food ration in which 26 families from Ah Nauk Ywe and 80 families from May Bone and Min Ba migrated.</li> <li>• Similarly, newborn populations are also not getting the food.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Families not receiving food rations are requesting food rations.</li> </ul>
<b>Health</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MHAA is responsible to provide health service.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Health service in general are inadequate to meet needs</li> </ul>

<b>Shelter</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• LWF assessed the shelter situation. Based on the preliminary report, 76 shelters out of 85 require minor and major repair and maintenance. LWF provided shelter maintenance kits for collapsing shelters in the camp.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Most of the shelters have partial to major damage. CMC requested repair support.</li> </ul>
<b>WASH</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Solidarity is responsible for wash.</li> <li>• Solidarity is assisting for drinking water in the camp. SI shared that it will be difficult to supply water in expected quantity due to lack of source.</li> <li>• There are 4 ponds in the camp but 2 ponds are in use, one is in the New Nget Chaung 1 and another one is in the Old Nget Chaung 1. CMC requested to renovate all the ponds.</li> <li>• 13 Latrines were renovated.</li> <li>• Bio Compost tank is almost finished.</li> <li>• Organizing camp cleaning throughout the year 2014.</li> <li>• Solidarity provided the chlorine in camp but community don't want to drink the chlorinated water because of its smell and taste.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CMC members and IDPs asked to maintain latrines because some latrines are damaged.</li> </ul>
