It is observed that some of CMC members that is appointed by the government resigned citing lack of time.</li> <li>Conducted camp level Inter-agency coordination meeting on 29th January where 34 (11 Female) representatives from CMC, CDN, IRC, Community Service, EiE and CCCM from LWF participated and discussed on camp activities and issues.</li> <li>Government provided 2 wheelers to CMC to serve IDPs for school transportation and medical attention purposes.
