3. Matters arising

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1.	Confusion regarding role of actors in response especially the Greek Asylum Service (GAS) and UNHCR, it is important to communicate the extent of their roles to POC in order to manage expectations of asylum applications and legal procedures. Transportation is a common topic of confusion PoC expect GAS and UNHCR to cover transportation. GAS is a governmental agency in charge of operating the asylum procedures but not to offer legal counselling or services beyond its scope or mandate.	Q & A for UNHCR supported accommodation to be shared with WG; when translations in relevant languages are ready
2	New guidance available within Q & A for UNHCR supported accommodation on transportation and UNHCR's role in transporting PoC from e.g. sites to Asylum Service appointments, hospitals or relocation or family reunification travel costs. This will clarify transportation assistance.	
3	. "Basic Information for People in need of International Protection in Greece", a 19 page document now available on Asylum Service website.	
4	UNHCR website now launched online in Greek, English, French, Arabic, Farsi: informative website drafted with CWC + legal UNHCR staff, it includes Asylum Procedures as they apply in Greece and a section 'Living in Greece' will be added, with applicable social rights in Greece, such as right to work, to be available on site. 4. Education Sector WG survey findings

accommodations	February March 2017 to reflect the current access of refugee children to formal and non-formal education in "off-site"	



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accommodations, hotel apartments, shelters, which were not as highly prioritized as official sites at the beginning of the education campaign.	
The findings show statistics of children enrolled in schools and/or attending informal education classes or not involved in any educational activities in all parts of Greece including the islands (less represented). Recommendations and Action Points are included at the end including increasing all-round access to education and support (homework, mother-tongue) a particular focus on adolescents, pre-school-aged children, unaccompanied children, and children on the move.
