

SITE UPDATES

National CCCM Cluster

- Conducted an assessment of newly displaced populations at the Temporary Protected Area (TPA) adjacent to the UNMISS Temporary Operating Base in Leer town looking at physical conditions in the site, key needs, intentions and governance structures. Next steps for humanitarian support in site will be discussed at the inter-Cluster level.
- Conducted a joint CCCM and Protection Cluster assessment in Melut to investigate intentions to relocate IDPs from Dethomas 1 and 2, Khor Adar and Malek, and the possible CCCM Cluster response.

- The January population count showed a decline in the PoC and collective centres. This was likely due to an improvement in the security situation inside Wau town since the New Year period, with people returning to their homes.
- Camp management have been supporting UNMISS to enhance perimeter protection around the PoC by constructing five new guard posts and upgrading two more over the past two months.

Bentiu PoC Site

- WASH casual workers went on strike in the Bentiu PoC site demanding financial incentives. The majority of services have been suspended as workers on strike have blocked access to humanitarians. Camp management are conducting negotiations with striking workers, their respective agencies and community leaders to resolve the situation as soon as possible, and at the national level the CCCM Cluster has been engaging with OCHA and the Health and WASH Clusters to determine a response.
- The January population count indicated that 120,049 individuals are currently residing in Bentiu PoC. Overcrowding is critical; new arrivals are residing in communal areas. Camp management continue to advocate with UNMISS to permit shelter construction in the contingency space.

- During the general food distribution, camp management coordinated with WFP to identify and note newborn children so that they receive corn soya blend (CSB) biscuits once they reach six months. Camp management also met with community leaders to allay concerns about the sorghum being distributed which they believed was causing health problems.
- Camp management identified gaps in education and GBV activities as service providers are currently awaiting funding for 2017 and have been forced to reduce activities to a minimum.
 The CCCM Cluster is following up with the GBV Sub-cluster and Education Cluster at the national level to identify how to minimize service disruption.

Juba UN House PoC Site

 Camp management completed the relocation of families and groups transferred from the UNMISS Tongping temporary site from communal shelters to individual shelters to alleviate congestion at the site; new arrivals still living in communal shelters will be targeted next.
