UNHCR Drought Response at 30 June 2017



75,000 Individuals

provided with assistance in June



44,000 individuals were provided with drinking water through trucked water delivery and borehole rehabilitation (23,910 in Togdheer, 16,800 in Lower Juba, 2,400 in Sanaag and 890 in Sool regions)*.



28,000 individuals benefited from core relief items (CRI)** (2,600 plastic sheets were distributed to 2,600 households (15,400 individuals) in Woqooyi Galbeed region; 1,000 CRI kits were distributed to 1,000 households (6,000 individuals) in Galgaduud region; 600 plastic sheets were distributed to 600 households (3,600 individuals) in Togdheer region and 500 emergency CRI kits were distributed to 500 households (3,000 individuals) in Mudug region.



2,494 individuals were reached with Gender Based Violence (GBV) response including the distribution of 148 dignity kits in Togdheer, Banadir and Bari regions and the participation of 2,235 individuals in awareness raising sessions in Bay, Banadir and Togdheer regions. Psychological counseling was provided to 111 GBV survivors in Banadir and Togdheer regions.



32 people with special needs were provided with orthopedic appliances inTogdheer region.

Situation overview


From 1 to 30 June, UNHCR's Protection & Returns Monitoring System (PRMN), recorded 52,000 individuals nationwide displaced by the drought, bringing the total of drought driven displaced since November 2016 to 790,000.


The number of newly displaced by the drought has seen a slight increase compared to the previous month (May: 46,000).

Baidoa and Mogadishu remain two of the most affected areas with 22,000 and 12,000 new arrivals in June.


Some 16,000 IDP returns were recorded during the month primarily from IDP sites in Baidoa town to home locations within Baidoa district and elsewhere in Bay region.
