### HIGHLIGHTS

Over 130,000 new internal displacements in Somalia were monitored by the UNHCR-led Protection & Return Monitoring Network (PRMN) during July 2017. Displacements where drought was identified as the primary driver increased for the third month running to 68,000 compared to May and June figures of 46,000 and 52,000 respectively. It is important to note that since the network tracks movements, some of the displacements may involve secondary or tertiary displacements and do not therefore indicate the totality of the displaced population.

While drought continues to be the driver of the majority of displacements seen in the month of July, conflict-induced displacement remains high, and continues to form the backdrop also for the context within which those primarily driven by drought take place.

Some 60,000 new displacements directly induced by conflict were monitored in July, the highest monthlyfigure so far this year. The majority (40,000) of these originated in Lower Shabelle triggered by fighting in Marka district while a further 2,800 were displaced in Kurtunwaarey district as a result of fighting between AI Shabaab and Somali forces. Clan conflict in Cabudwaaq, Galgaduud has also led to displacements of a further 14,000 individuals during July.

### Priority Needs

PRMN partners interview displaced households on arrival (as well as key informants) and record two priority needs of these newly displaced. Over time (see chart on page 2), needs of the displaced have evolved - while food (the top first need) and shelter (the top second need) remain important, increasingly, livelihood support is identified as an urgent need. Furthermore, healthcare and need for humanitarian aid are increasingly cited as an urgent need which may count as an indication of an increase in the vulnerability of the newly displaced.

#### About PRMN

The PRMN (Protection & Return Monitoring Network) is a UNHCR-led project which identifies and reports on displacements (including returns) of populations in Somalia. The network also identifies and reports on protection risks and incidents underlying such movements. Only figures collected by PRMN are reported above. Not all displacements in Somalia are captured. 
