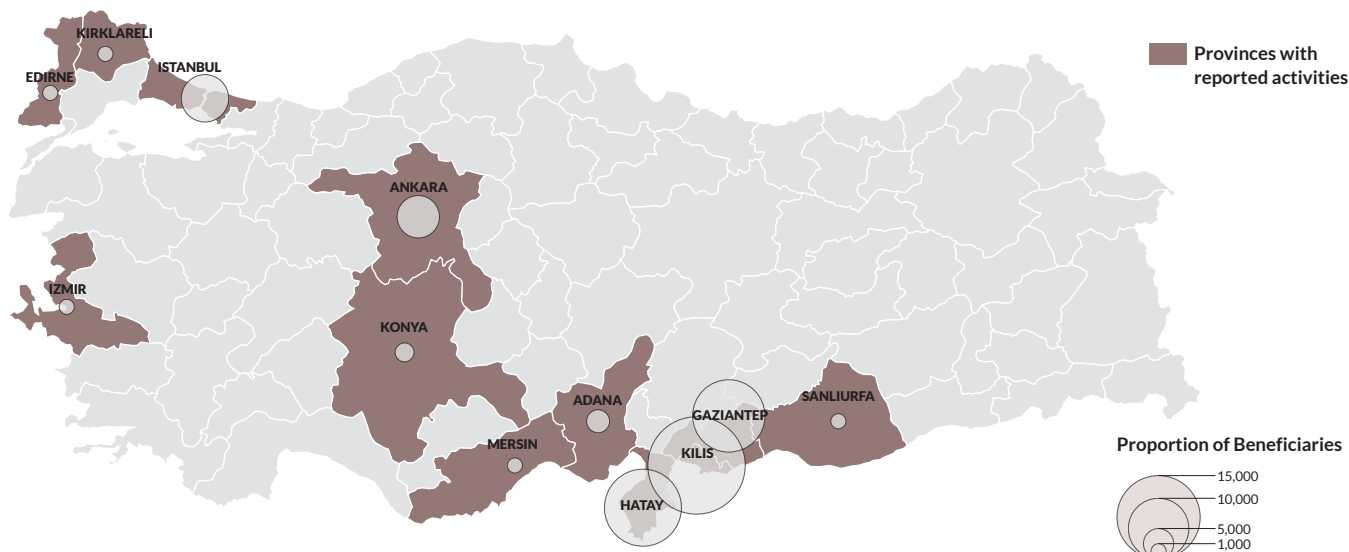

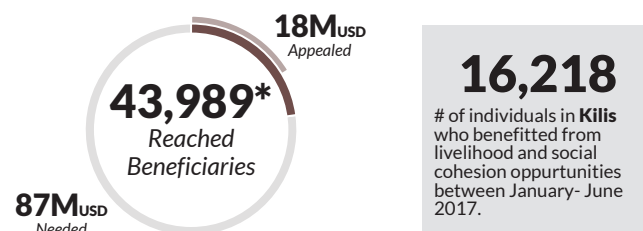
## NARRATIVE

A total of **43,989** Syrians under Temporary Protection and host community members (of which around 48% women) benefited directly from livelihoods support in 2017, including: over 400 Syrians under Temporary Protection and host community members who increased their income through self-employment and more than 940 job placements.

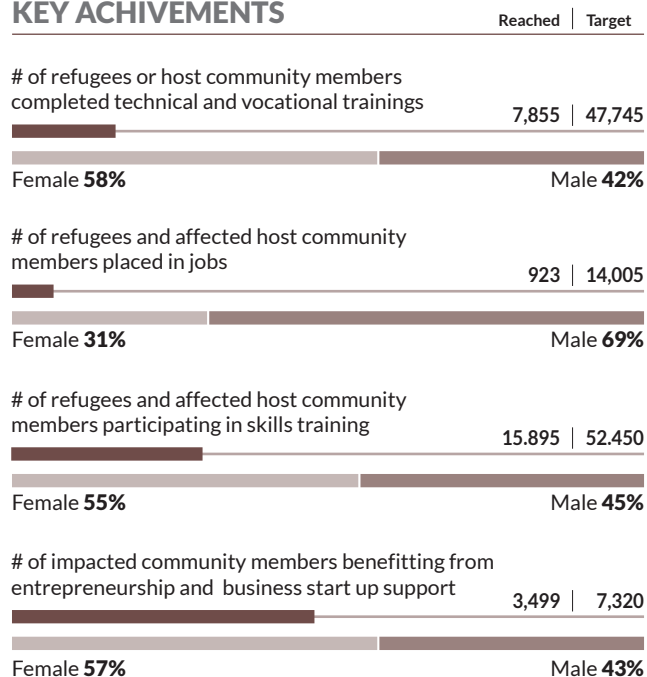
Over **19,705** Syrians under Temporary Protection completed language and basic life skills training and **8,251** completed technical and vocational training. Over **4,306** Syrians under Temporary Protection and host community members benefited from entrepreneurship and business start-up support.

A Business employment forum was organized which was attended by over 800 people. The forum was an important contribution to increased awareness and information sharing amongst private sector partners on Syrians under Temporary Protection employment and explore ways for private sector to hire more people from affected communities (both Syrians under Temporary Protection and host community members).
