

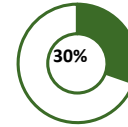
These dashboards reflect selected regional sectoral indicators on the humanitarian and resilience responses of more than 240 partners involved in the 3RP Inter-Agency Appeal in Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon and Turkey. Achievements are regionally aggregated and cumulative from the start of 2017 and targets are based on full funding of the 3RP 2017 and an expected population of 4.7 million refugees by end-2017.

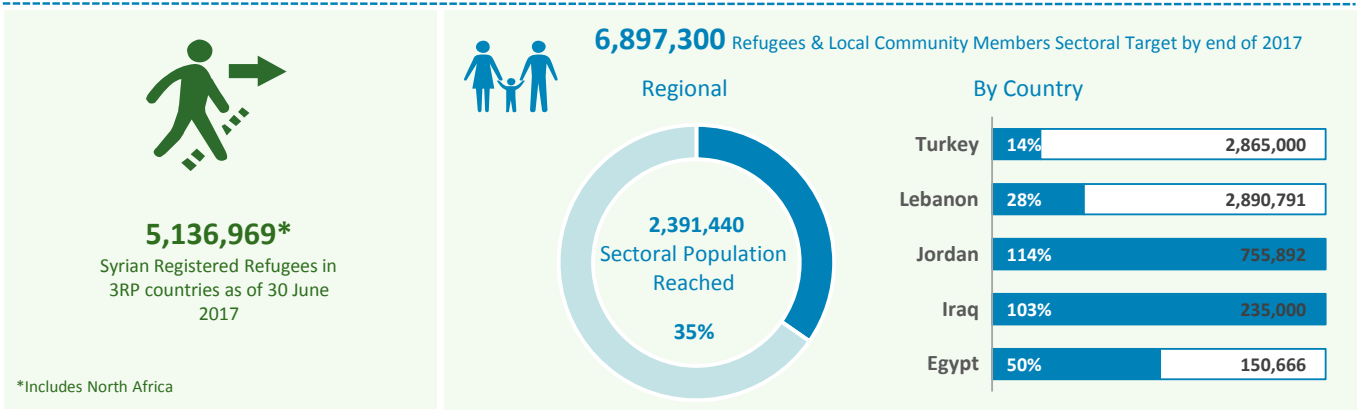

As the Syria crisis entered its seventh year in March, the number of Syrian refugees in the region passed the five million mark. There are now almost 3 million Syrian refugees registered in Turkey, over 1 million in Lebanon, some 661,000 in Jordan, almost 237,000 in Iraq and above 120,000 in Egypt, indicating the generosity of countries across the region.

The total net increase since 1 January 2017 is 286,970 refugees, mostly due to registration of Syrian refugees who had already been residing in Turkey. This indicates that, despite the ongoing violence inside Syria, few Syrians are currently able to reach neighbouring countries, illustrating the ongoing management of borders across the region. Humanitarian partners call for respect of basic rights, protection and physical security of all populations, including those stranded at borders.

So far in 2017, over 84,000 Syrian refugees in the 3RP countries have received or are receiving services related to the prevention and response to sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV). Furthermore, 27,800 individuals have been trained on protection including child protection and SGBV services. More than 338,000 girls and boys participating in structured, sustained child protection or psychosocial support programmes. More than 664,000 individuals reached through awareness or information campaigns/sessions.

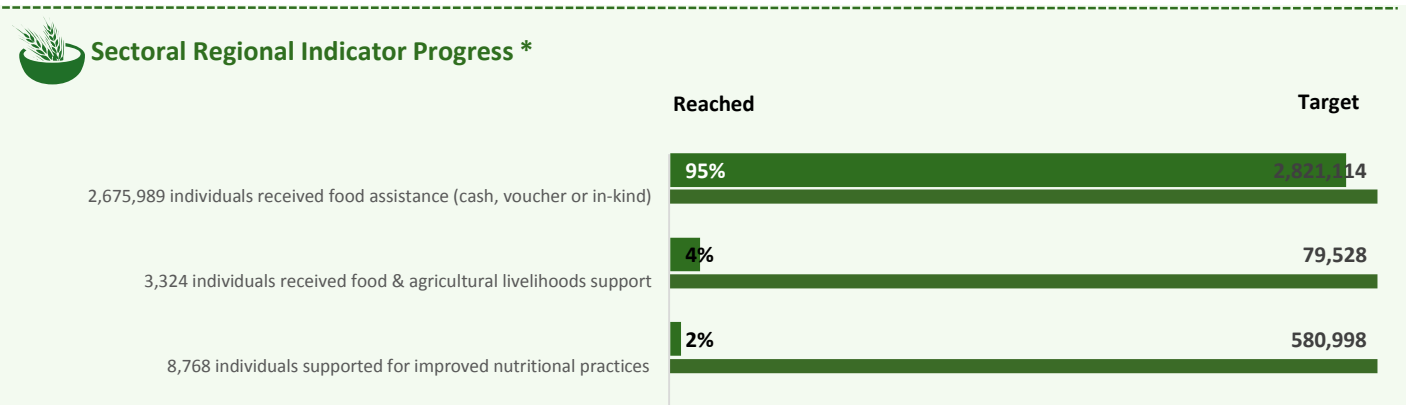
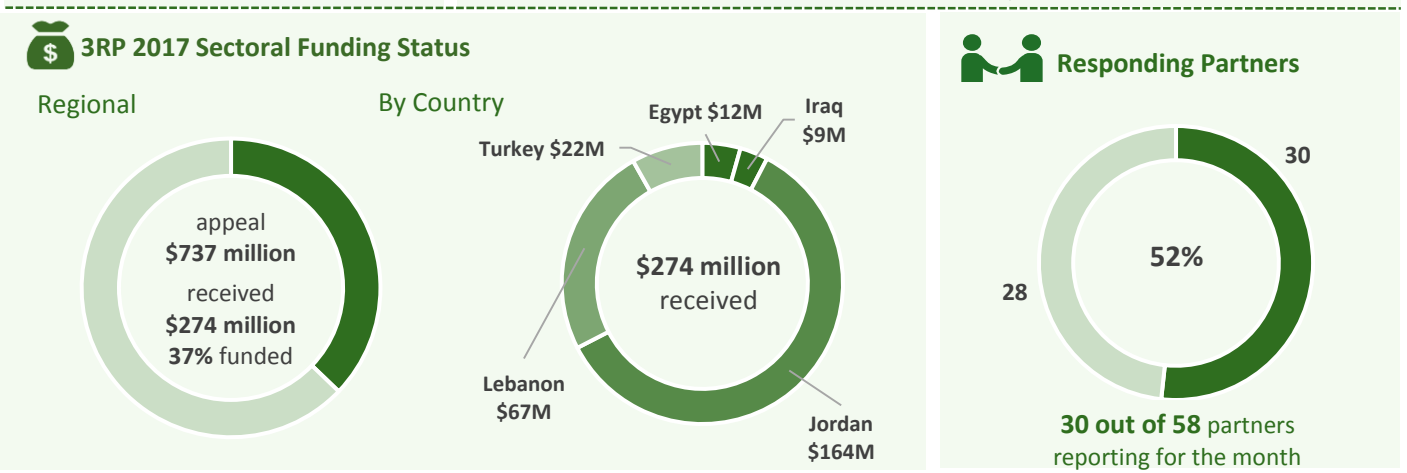
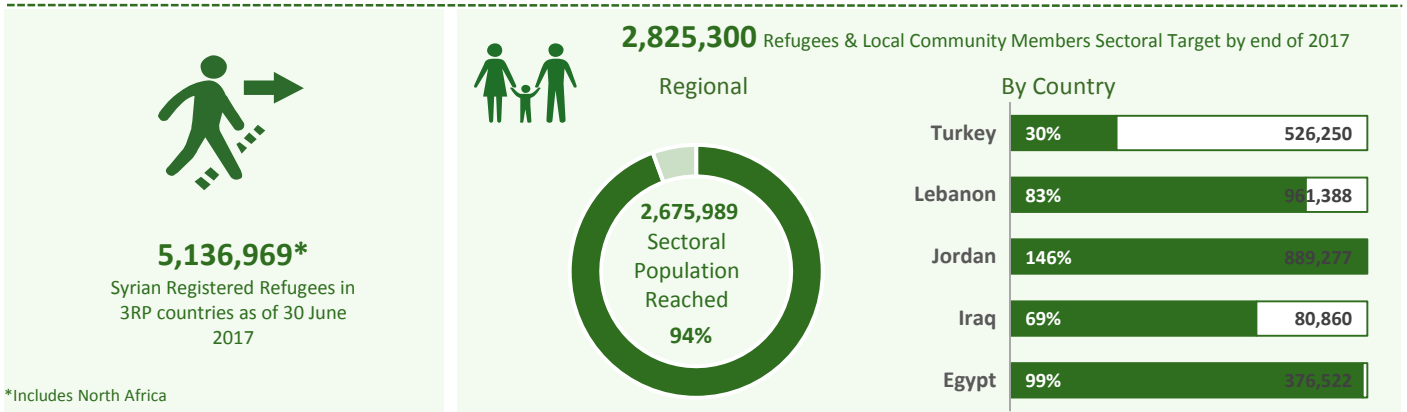

During 2017, food sector partners have reached approximately 2.67 million individuals with food assistance through cash, voucher or in kind modality. 3,300 individuals have received food and agricultural livelihoods support while 8,700 individuals have been supported for improved nutritional practices.

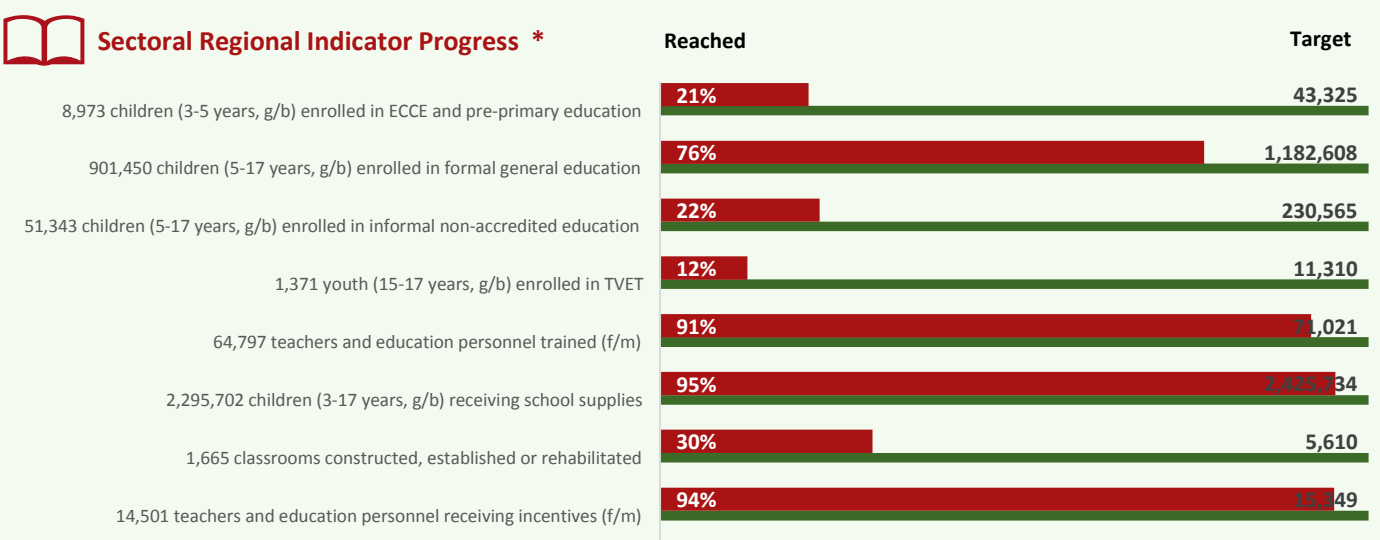
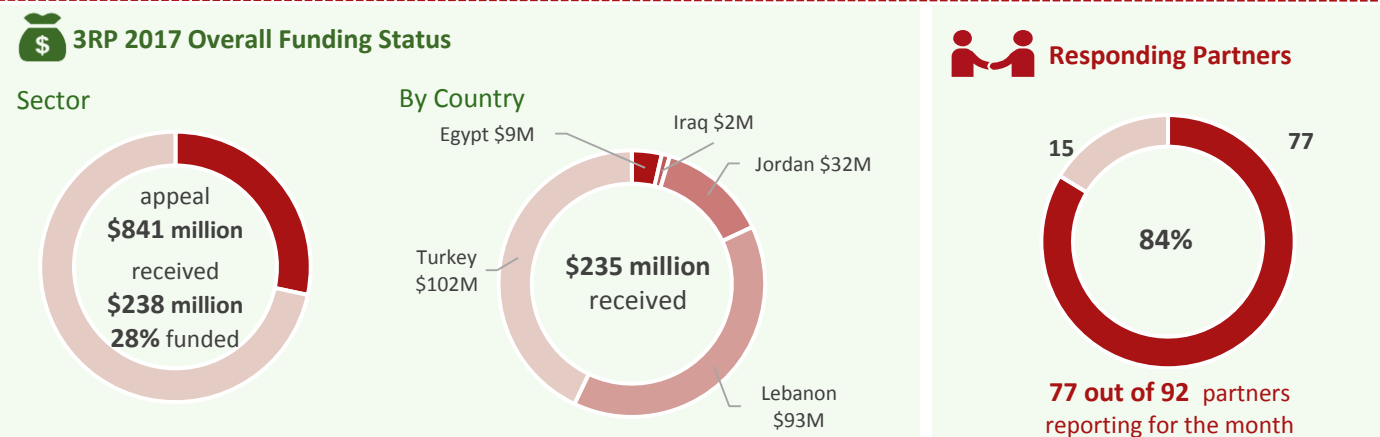
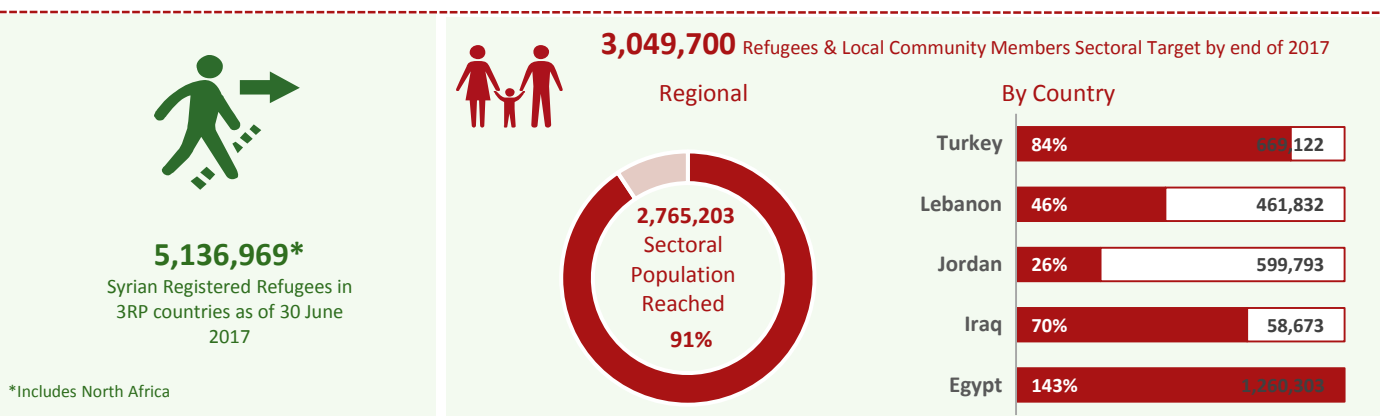
In June 2017, Food Sector partners in Egypt supported vulnerable refugees through monthly cash based transfer (CBT) entitlements in addition to providing food assistance to school children. The Egyptian Vulnerability Assessment for Refugees (EVAR) final report will be released soon. In Iraq, the Joint Vulnerability Assessment (JVA) is due to begin by the end of July 2017 and will cover refugees inside and outside the camps. The results of this survey will produce a set of targeting indicators, which will further enable a needs-based refinement of the current caseload. In Jordan, food assistance is provided to Syrian refugees, vulnerable host communities as well as to formal and non-formal school children. 3RP partners in Turkey provided food assistance to 146,897 refugees (142,097 in camps/ 4,800 off-camp).

As at the end of June, some 901,450 Syrian children across the region are enrolled in formal education in schools located in camps and host communities. Additionally, around 51,343 Syrian children are enrolled in informal education.

To help address the high numbers of Syrian refugees that remain out of school in Iraq, 3RP Education partners finalised an agreement to run an e-learning pilot project delivering non-formal education to 300 out of school Syrian refugee children in grade 2 to 6. The current pilot projects in Erbil have received positive feedback from children and parents, who noted significant strides in children's knowledge and skills. In Lebanon, the first round of the Accelerated Learning Programme (ALP) for 2017, which targets children aged 7-17 years who have missed two years or more of formal schooling, concluded in early June with 5,854 children (3,010 boys and 2,844 girls) sitting for the post-test. The success rate was 62%, which is an increase of 16% from the 2016 ALP summer round. In Turkey, 3RP partners constructed a total of seven two-storey prefabricated schools. Each of which has 23 classrooms and can accommodate up to 1,380 students.



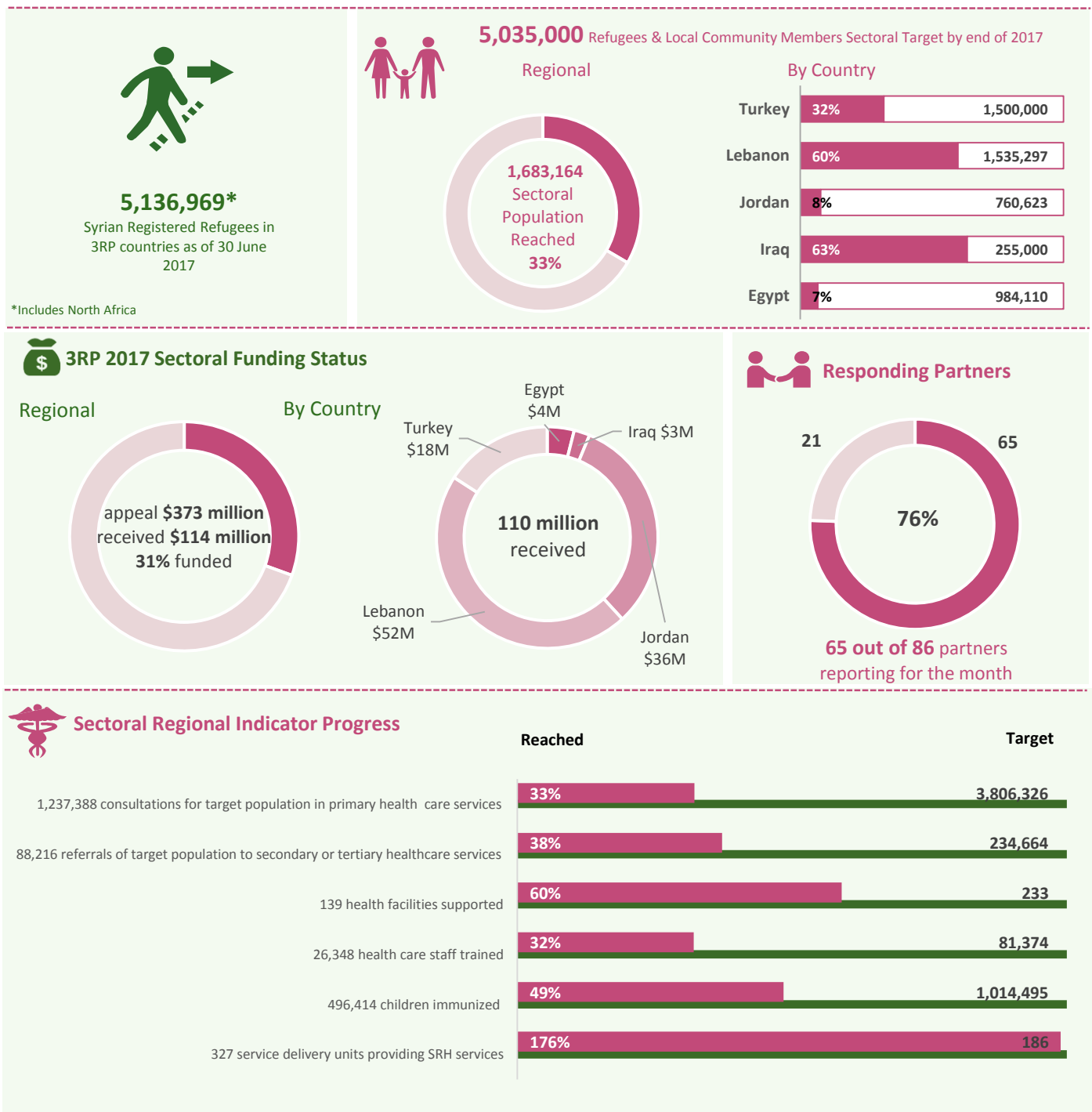

By the end of June 2017, over 1.2 million primary health care consultations were provided, representing over 33 per cent of the 2017 overall target, and over 88,000 were referred to secondary or tertiary health care. Furthermore, 496,000 children have been immunized and 26,000 health care staff have been trained.

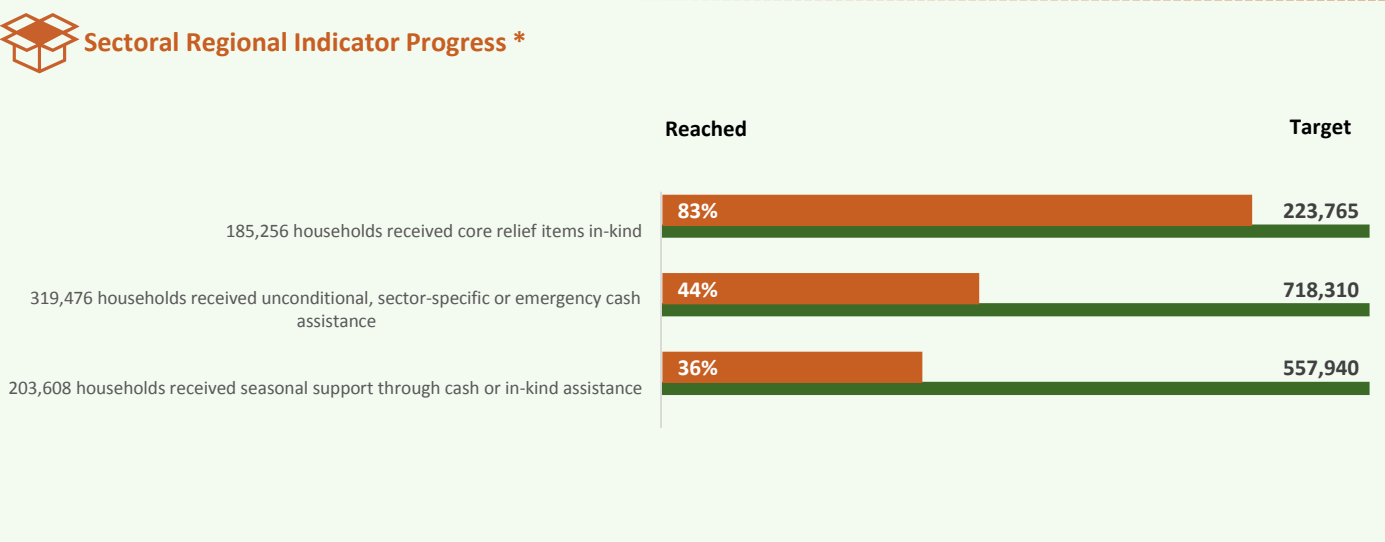
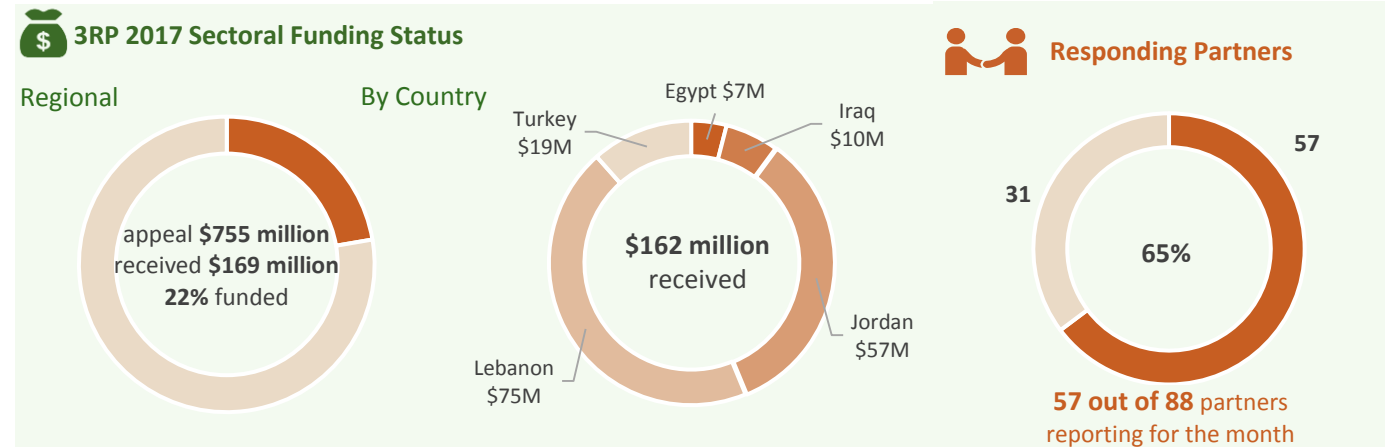
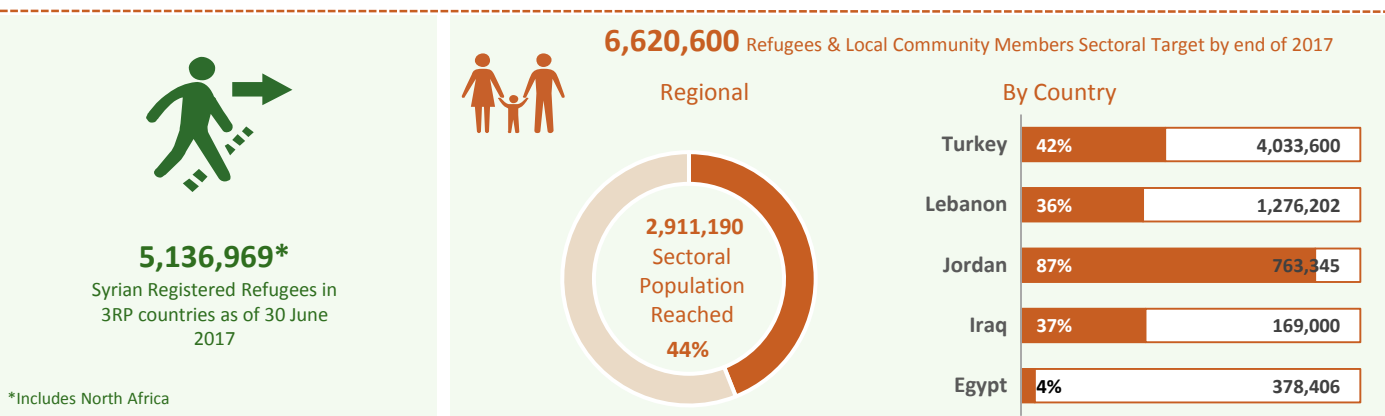
In Jordan, as part of support to FP, ANC and anemia prevention activities, 3RP partners has offered Depo-Provera injectable family planning method and Ferro folate tablets for sector partners use during 2017. In Lebanon, Health Sector partners led the development and finalization of the Child Survival "THRIVE" programme, which was preceded with a series of consultations with non-governmental partners on the three pillars of the initiative, including national framework and knowledge management; service access and quality; as well as trust, knowledge and community participation. Furthermore, in Lebanon the regular delivery of services and outreach to Syrian refugees remains a challenge due to the mobility of Syrian refugees and continuous evictions of displaced people.

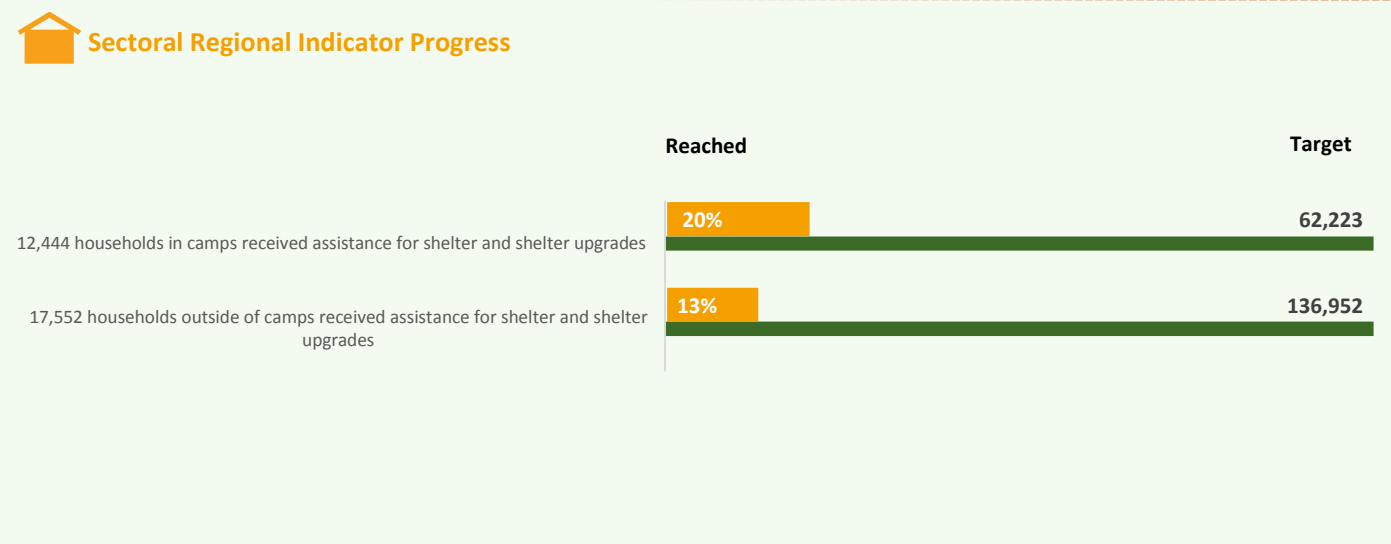
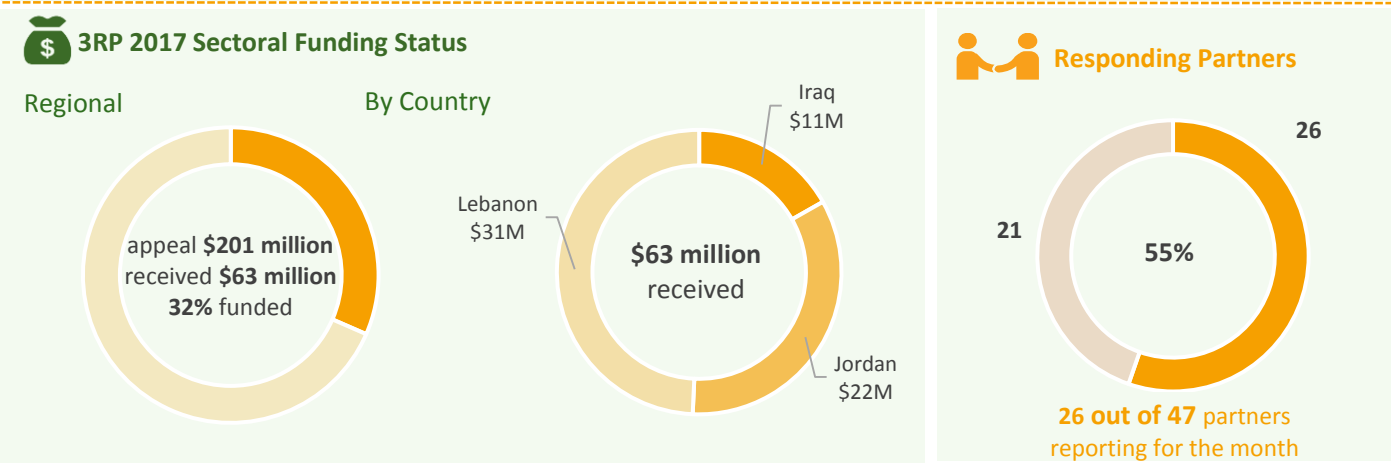
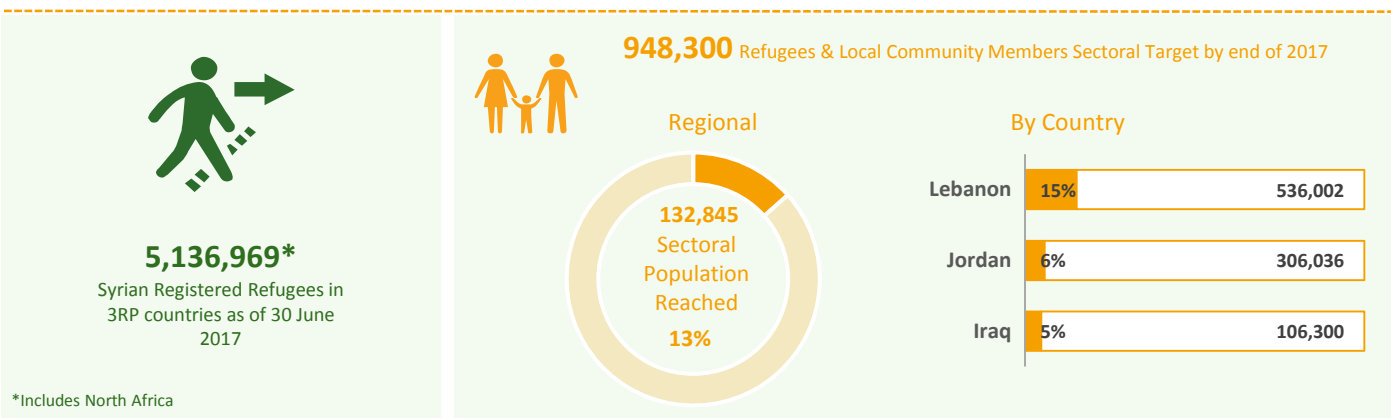
The basic needs sector aims to strengthen the capacities and resilience of local governance through development of simplified service delivery standards, provision of required equipment and skills development. Until June 2017, 185,000 households have received core relief items in kind, which is just over 83 per cent of the targeted population. Approximately 319,000 households have received unconditional, sector specific or emergency cash assistance and over 203,600 households received seasonal support through cash or in kind assistance.

In Turkey, The ESSN visibility campaign began on 20 June to explain to audiences within the European Union how the programme is changing the lives of vulnerable refugees. Furthermore, in Turkey, 3RP partners have monitored 422 Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations (SASFs), 18 service centres, and 225 Halkbank branches in 79 provinces. Common issues include language barriers, lacking awareness among SASFs and refugees, and inconsistent procedures in registering and changing addresses. In Jordan, 3RP partners provided around 6,395,841 US\$ worth of regular cash and non-food items (NFIs) to vulnerable beneficiaries from the refugee and host community.

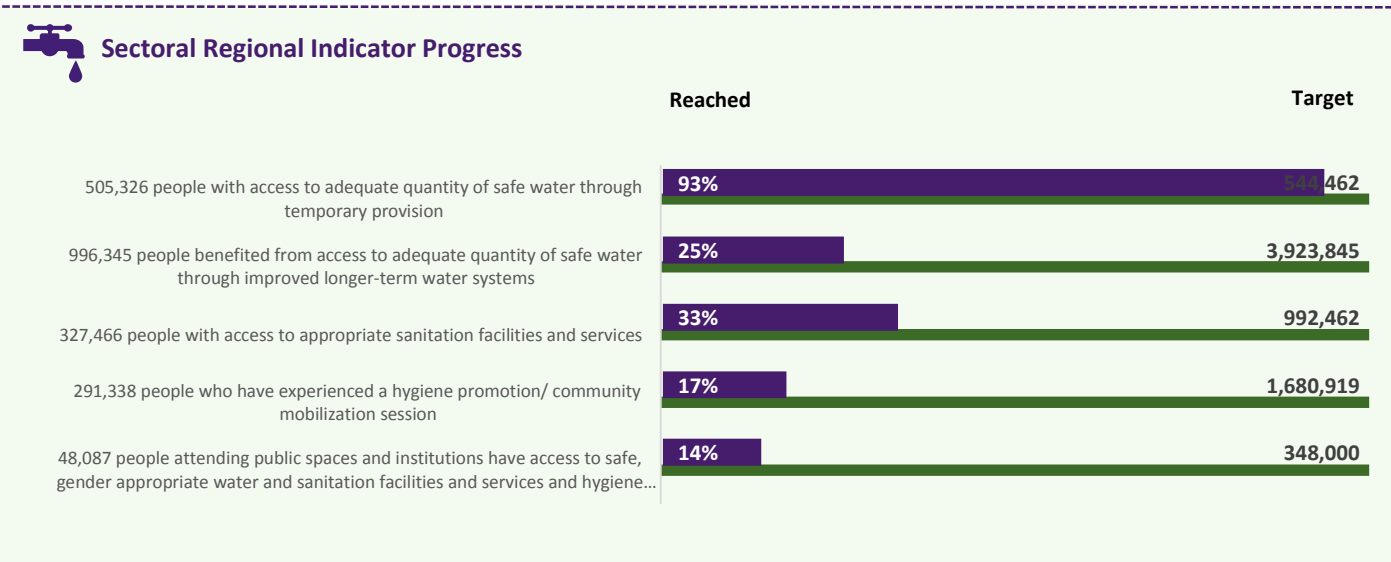
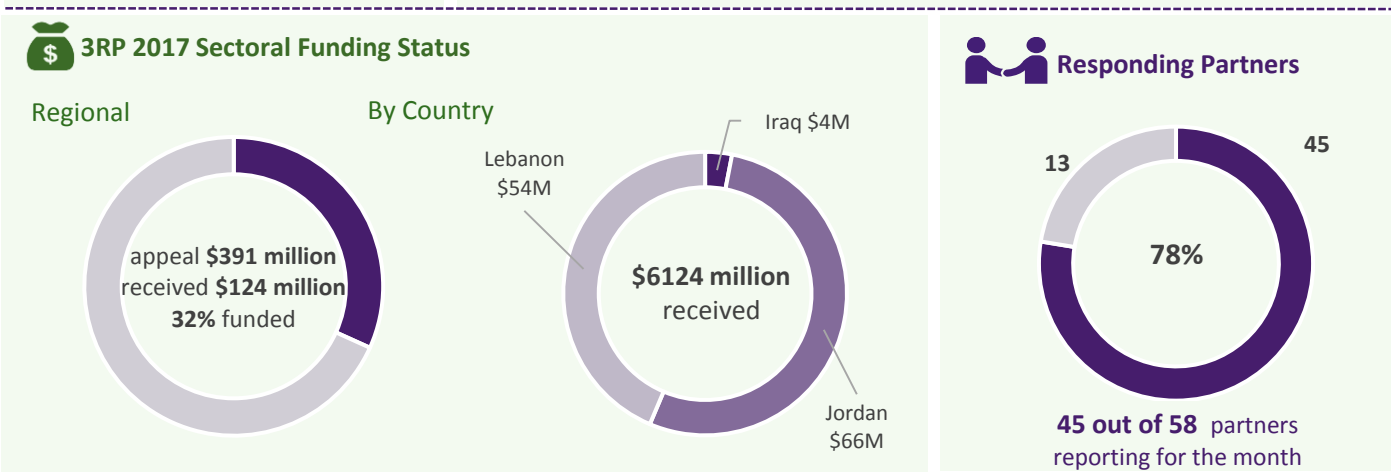
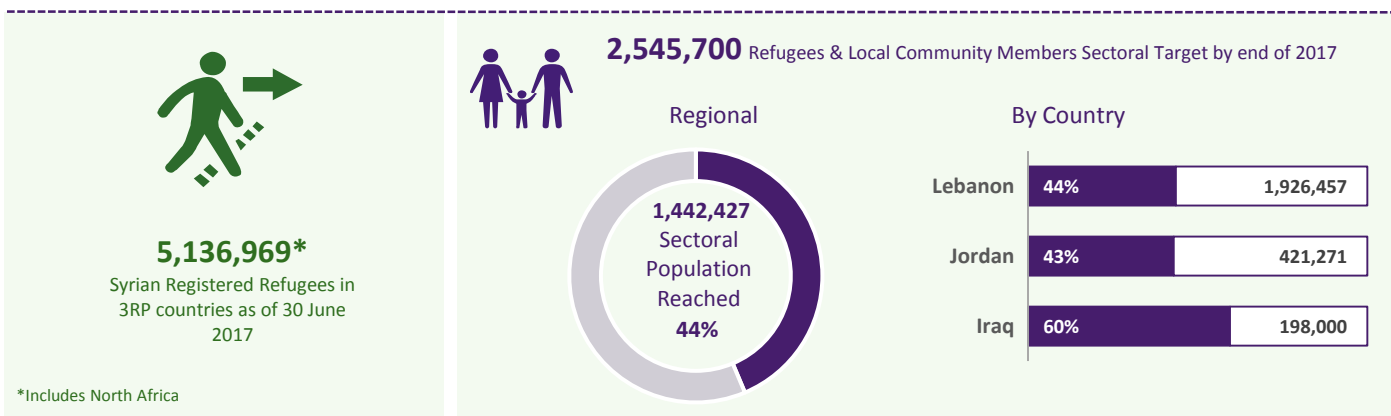
3RP partners' priority regarding the Shelter Sector continues to be the provision of adequate, affordable and sustainable housing options for refugees living in host communities. For refugees in camps, 3RP partners focus on rehabilitation efforts to improve the infrastructure of the camp and upgrade shelters in order to contribute to sustainable living. During 2017, 12,444 households in camps have received assistance for shelter and shelter upgrades, while outside of camps 17,552 households received assistance for shelter and shelter upgrades.

So far in 2017, over 996,300 individuals have benefited from access to adequate quantity of safe water through improved longer-term water systems. Approximately 327,400 people have gained access to appropriate sanitation facilities and services, and over 505,300 people have access to adequate quantity of safe water through temporary provision.

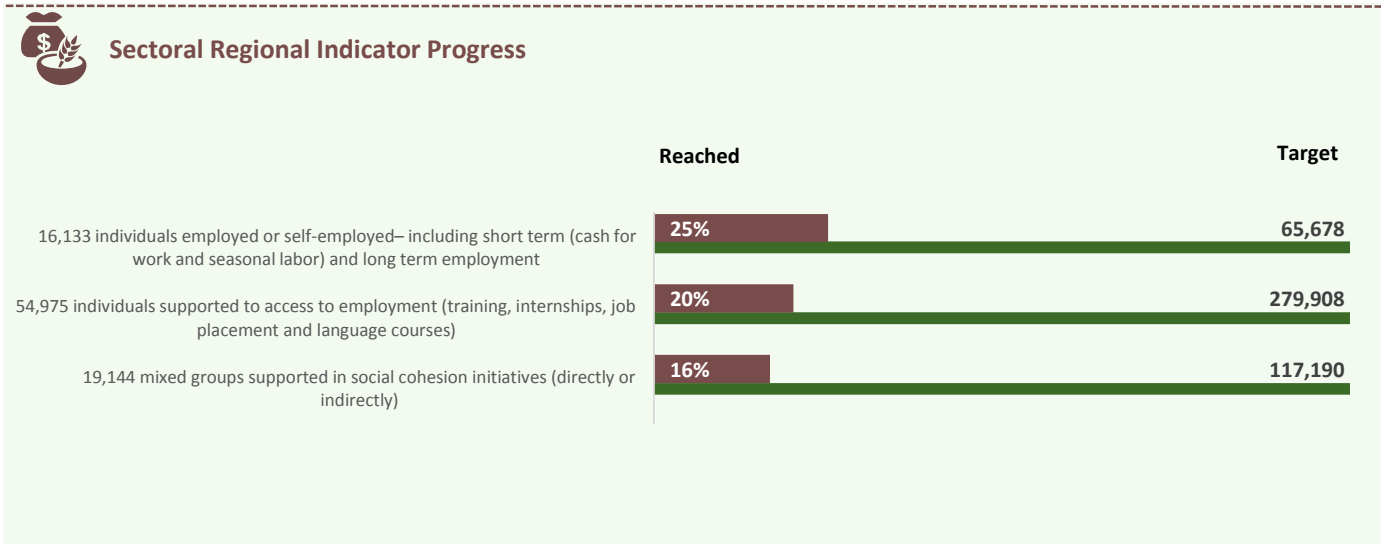
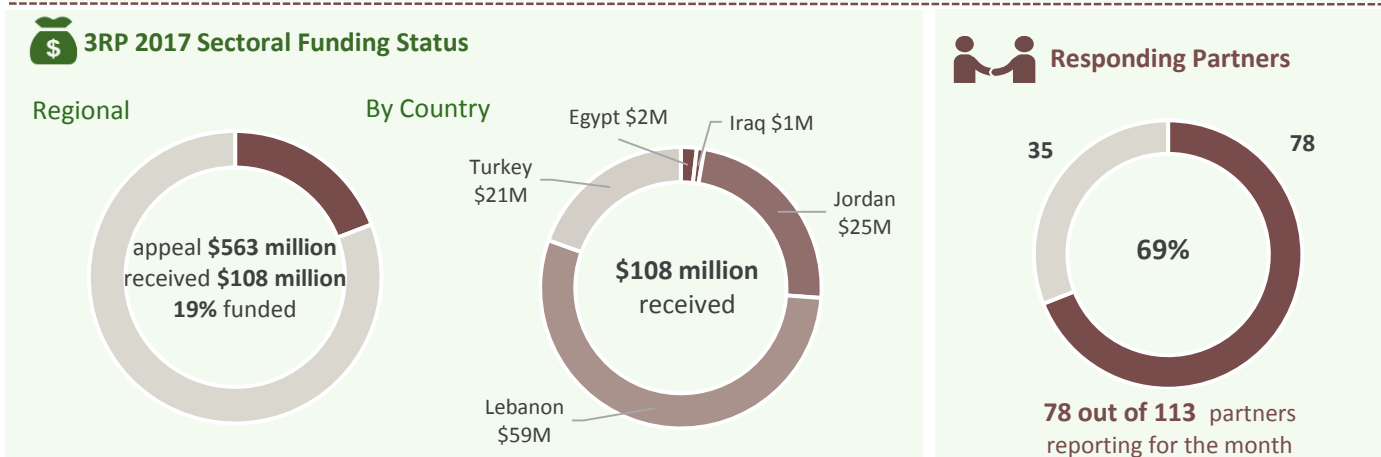
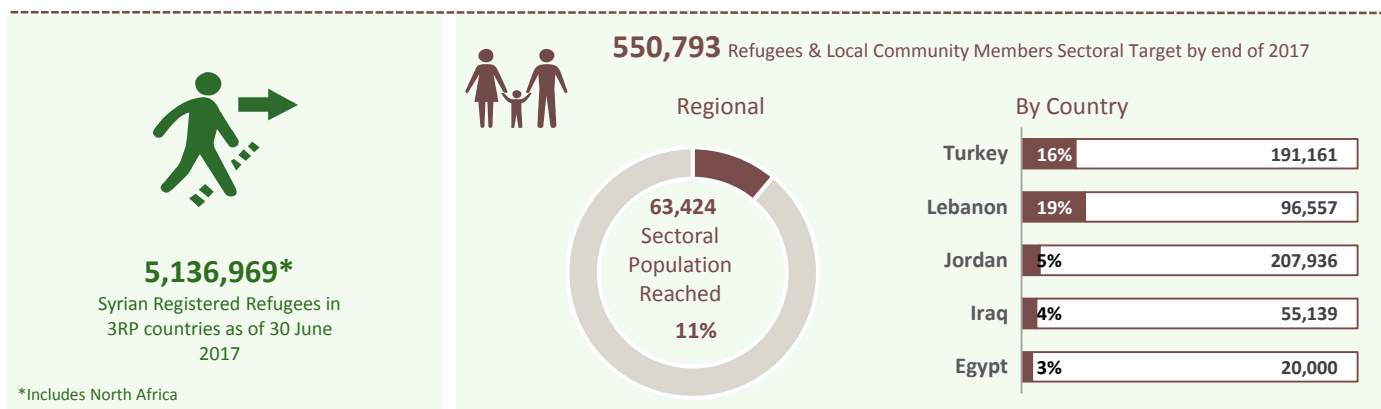
In Jordan, in Azraq, the expansion of the water network continued with the completion of 53 additional tap stands. The construction of 152 WASH blocks in Village 2 extension was completed benefiting more than 4,000 people, and 38 ramps were constructed to improve access of people with disabilities to WASH facilities in the camp. In Iraq, water demand increases each summer, as temperature regularly rise to 45 degrees centigrade or more. This coupled with an overall worsening ground water situation and reduced electricity supply hours, has presented challenges for WASH partners. As both quality and quantity of water from groundwater sources has declined. New bore wells are planned to serve Erbil camps, while in Dahuk water trucking has been increased and feeding a pipeline extended connecting the area to existing nearby wells, serving 1,200 people. In the longer term, alternative solutions include connecting to surface water sources rather than ground water.

Since the start of 2017, Livelihoods Partners assisted 16,133 refugees and host community members with short-term and/or long-term employment opportunities and 54,975 youth and adults in increasing their employability through job training, internships, job placement and language courses. In addition, 19,144 host community members and the refugees have participated in community based activities to promote social cohesion.

In Jordan, the mechanism that was used to allocate work permits and manage the leave system in Za'atari camp was presented and once the technicalities are solved, the new Za'atari Office for Employment (ZOE) and the leave mechanism at the main gate will be tested and fully functional. Private sector representatives have been visiting both camps in Jordan to locate eligible individuals for employment opportunities in host communities, including Carrefour in Za'atari, Pine Tree garment factory in Azraq. Furthermore, job fairs are to be offered at both camps on a continuous basis.
