

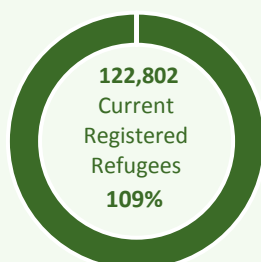


UNHCR continued its joint capacity building programme with the Ministry of Education. During this reporting period, 361 teachers were trained. The training was conducted over a period of one week by senior academics from MoE and University professors. The training targetted maths and science teachers working with Syrian refugee students attending public schools in Cairo, Alexandria, Giza, Sharkeyya, Qalyoubeyya and Damietta.

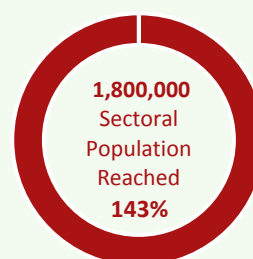
Approximately 35,884 Syrian refugee students have finished national exams for basic and secondary education grades. The results are being prepared and analyzed in order to measure the achievement of the refugee students. To improve and maximize the protection space to all children in public schools, UNHCR in partnership with the Egyptian Red Crescent and MoE, implemented its "Sehha wi Salama" project in 20 schools. This very innovative programme has 6 main components, each is designed and printed in a separate, child friendly and attractive booklet for children between 9-15 years. Teachers, students and the parents are trained on 6 components relating to; Disagree without violence, Environmental changes, Safety on the road, Healthy eating habits, Facing emergencies and First aid. This intervention benefited around 17,000 children in the 20 targeted schools as well as their teachers and their parents.



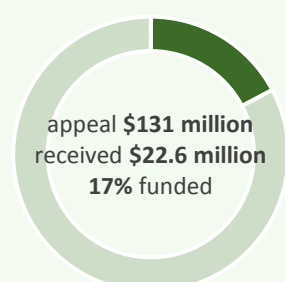
113,000 Syrian Refugees
expected by end-2017



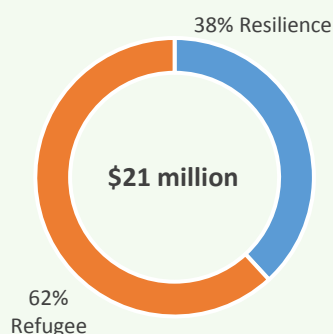
1,260,303 Refugees & Local
