



In May 2017, UNHCR continued to provide counselling on legal and administrative-related issues for Syrian refugees. As a result, 26 cases were referred to UNHCR's legal partner for legal assistance. Throughout the reporting period the legal assistance continued to be extended for a variety of reasons. Nevertheless civil registration was the main reason for referrals in 2016 and remain the same during reporting period.

In May, 418 children, adolescents and youth were assisted with structured and sustained PSS services provided by UNHCR's Partner Save the Children (SCI) and PSTIC/Tdh offered across Greater Cairo and Alexandria. In addition, UNICEF Partner Tdh operating in Greater Cairo and Alexandria extended PSS services to 3,054 children, adolescents and youth, the majority of which were boys aged 6-9 years (25%).

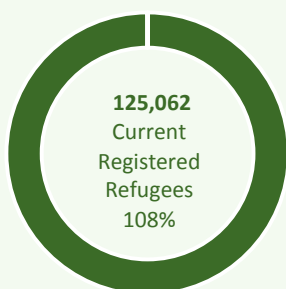
In May, 30 children newly benefitted from UNHCR/SCI's multi-sectoral case management, all of them being separated or unaccompanied children. Under UNICEF's case management partner Tdh, 712 children newly entered into Tdh's case management process; the majority of which reported to be boys aged 10-17 years (19%). During the reporting period, 3RP partners continued to focus on multisectoral approach for prevention and response to SGBV incidents. 321 new Syrian SGBV survivors were identified and supported.

During May 2017, five-day gender trainings were provided for a total of 87 Syrian children (43 girls and 44 boys) between the ages of 8 and 12. As a result of the training, children understood the importance to report any form of violence and how to seek help safely. The traditional perceptions of gender norms were also discussed and challenged by the children. In-depth training aiming to tackle harmful practices deeply-rooted in both the host and refugee communities such as early marriage were attended by 31 Syrian women.

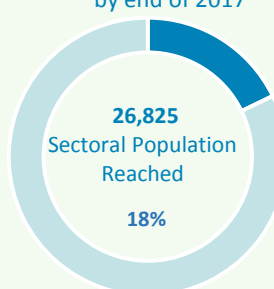
In May, 110 individuals were reached through six orientation meetings organized in different parts of Greater Cairo to establish contact between the Community Empowerment Project and refugee community groups and volunteer initiatives. During reporting period, the Unit delivered a session on UNHCR mandate and protection activities to 120 psych-social workers serving in public schools attending to Syrian refugees. The training was put together by UNHCR (Education Unit) in partnership with MoE.



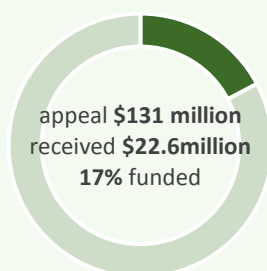

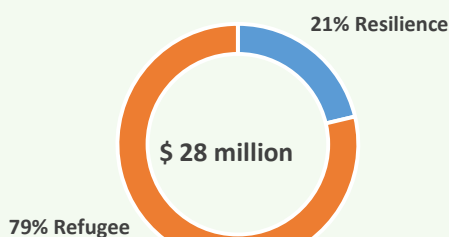

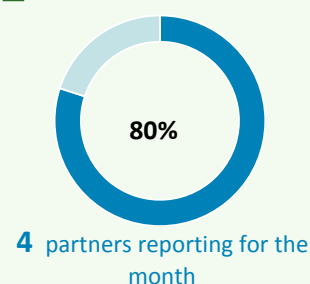
**3RP 2017 Funding Status**



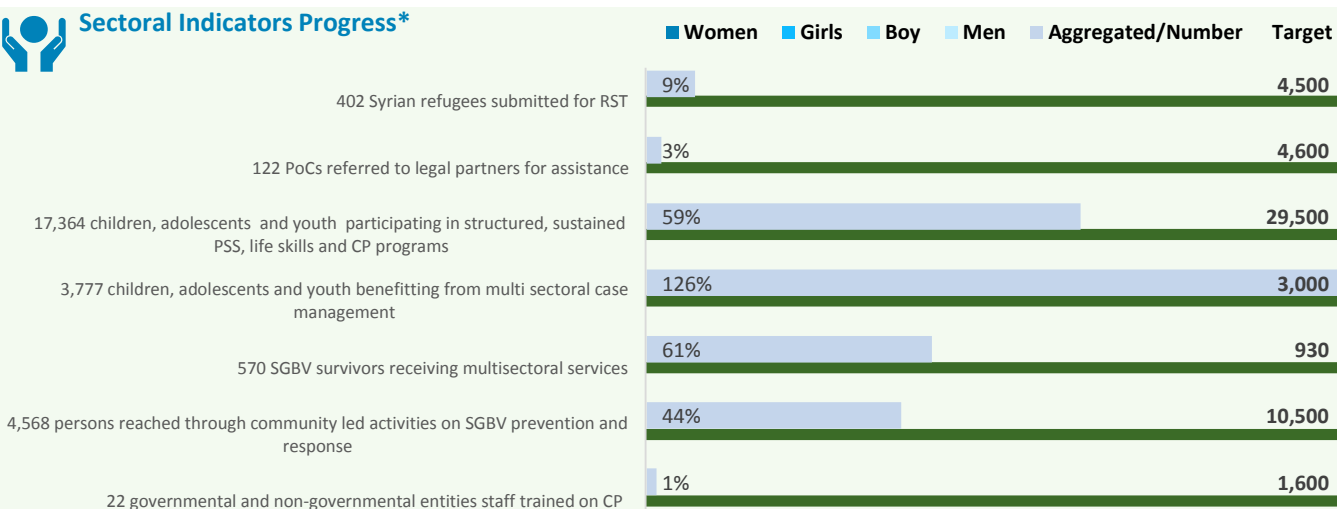
