Refugees and the most vulnerable within the impacted population are provided with <b>life-saving and immediate assistance</b>, including in camps and host communities.</li><li>3. The most vulnerable impacted communities benefit from immediate assistance to <b>strengthen communal services to support community-based protection</b>.</li></ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>4. ## 10 Assessment Criteria

It is proposed to combine the guidance included in these two documents to derive 10 criteria by which the various chapters will be assessed. These are:

1. **Resilience issues are included in the context (Section A)**
2. **Targeting is based on vulnerability assessments (Section C)**
3. **Use of national systems (Section D)**
4. **Partnering with local responders (Sections D and E)**
5. **Strengthening resilience capacities of individuals, communities and institutions (Section D)**
6. **Contribution to Social Cohesion (Section D)**
7. **Synergies between sectors and refugee and resilience components (Section D).**
8. **Longer-term programming (Section D)**
9. **Enhanced Coordination (Section E)**
10. **Expanded Partnership (Section E)**

For each criterion, instead of a score, the assessment will be in terms of a light which can easily be converted into a score if needed (0,1,2) .



For each criterion, the score will be explained in terms of what is good, and what improvements are recommended.
