


SOUTH SUDAN SITUATION

Country update

The borders, Nadapal with South Sudan remained open and the Immigration authorities have allowed South Sudanese applicants to enter. With the steady flow, 12476 new arrivals were registered in Kakuma camp and Kalobeyei settlement from January until the end of 30 June. The South Sudanese population represents the largest group in Kakuma including Kalobeyei.

There is a high number of primary school enrolment by South Sudanese population, %137 however, the secondary school enrolment remains very low, %27 due to several constraints in the camp like over-aged learners from South Sudan.


Among the new arrivals, % 20 of them received child protection multi-sectorial specific services especially the number of unaccompanied and separated children are high among the South Sudanese new arrivals. The number of reporting SGBV cases in Kalobeyei is increasing as a result of SGBV awareness activities done by partners and UNHCR in the field.
