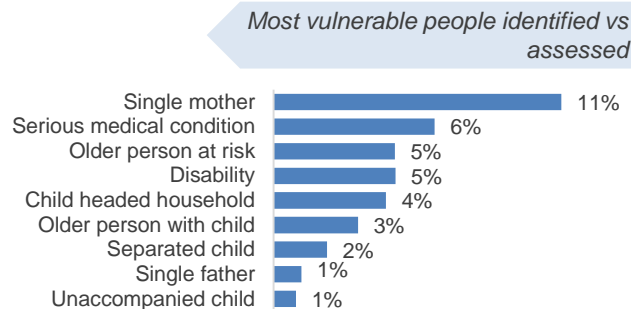

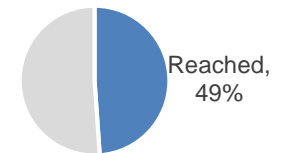

### SHELTER/NFI

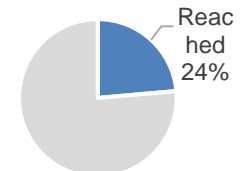
250,000 refugees targeted for Non food items distribution

250,000 refugees with access to water targeted

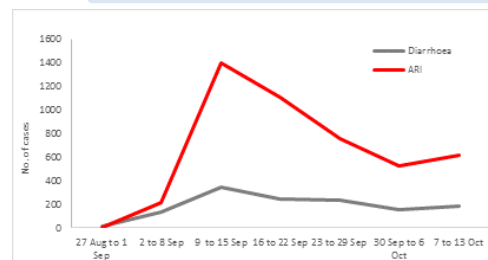
- Over 37,400 refugees have access to latrines
- Over 59,000 refugees have access to water



### HEALTH

Diarrhea & acute respiratory infection (ARI) cases among new arrivals

- 2 Diarrhoea Treatment Units and 3 health posts established
- Over 24,000 refugees received medical attention
- Over 60,000 refugees received OCV<sup>2</sup>
- Over 10,000 refugees (6 m. to 15 yrs) received MR<sup>3</sup> and OPV<sup>4</sup>



### FOOD & NUTRITION

SAM/MAM admissions

- Over 8,850 refugees received food through the community kitchen per day.
- 2,335 children admitted for SAM/MAM treatment
- 2,630 pregnant and lactating women admitted for treatment
