

### Age, gender composition




Women and children combined represent 85% of all returnees to date

Data on destinations for returnees from Kenya are generally based on the place of initial return. In the case of arrivals by road convoy in 2017, the final destination declared on arrival is used.




The boundaries and names shown on this map do not imply official endorsement or acceptance by the United Nations. Final boundaries between Somalia and Ethiopia has not yet been determined.
