Members updates	 Irbid Coordination/Northern: Northern actors (NGOs) had a big introductory meeting with the governor of Irbid on December 5, aiming to introduce the governor and other main government officials operating in the North of the available organisations and services being offered and planned in the North. The Service Guide has been presented to the governor as a supportive compilation of all projects presented that day, for his review. JCLA now actively present in the North focusing on legal awareness and representation with specific regard to child marriages. 16 Days of Activism events implemented by various actors in the north, and organisations cooperated together in some activities. JRP draft circulated to ESWG members after receipt from MOPIC, not many changes were made to Education document, but comments sent by today to JRP Secretariat.

Agencies are submitting EOIs to the chair (UNICEF) to be elected in the January meeting as this is MECI's last month of the co-chairing term.

The goal of the workshop was to Introduce the Global Child Labour in Emergencies Toolkit (Published by the Global Child Labour Task Force in 2016 and currently being field- tested by Plan and ILO as the co-leads) to the MENA region; to foster exchange, collaboration and coordination among child labour practitioners in the region; and to share and document lessons learnt, good practices and programme evidence in addressing child labour in emergencies. Priority actions included: developing common definition and minimum criteria for the mainstreaming of child labor in humanitarian programs as well as developing key messages on child labor for protection actors, which were both completed. Building on existing accomplishments and linking to the national framework on child labor, while reviewing the 2018 workplan more tangible activities shall be agreed on.
