





Total Received by Q2 515.2 million (19%)


LCRP 2017 Funding Received Q1 vs Q2

VASyR 2017

- Preliminary results will be presented at the next Inter-Agency meeting (11/08/2017)
- For the Health sector, the preliminary results will include:
 - % of HH had at least one member who needed PHC in the last 6 months
 - % of HH who were able to access PHC in the last 6 months
- Final results and the full list of indicators will be shared with UNHCR/WFP/ UNICEF in Sept/Oct (date tbc).
- The final report will be published in Nov/Dec (date also tbc)

Arsal Developments

As a result of the military operation, influx of refugees from Arsal outskirts to Arsal village

→ Joint Gov/Humanitarian actors Contingency Plan activated on 21/7

→ # of arriving from outskirts (from 21 to 26 July): 157 families/402 individuals

Health Response:

Ongoing/ at Wadi Hmayed checkpoint:

- MoPH/Beyond providing vaccination to all new arrivals at Wadi Hmayed checkpoint + high energy biscuits, ORS and first aid kits
- Islamic Medical Association providing medical referral services
- Coordination between IRC and IMC for the identification and referral of cases in need for MHPSS support
- 10 family members having varicella were prevented from entering Wadi Hmayed checkpoint but given medicine

On standby:

- LRC on standby at Labwe PHC with 10 cars and 40 volunteers
- Field hospitals on standby

IASC GBV Guidelines roll-out within the Health Sector

- Reminder: first training will take place on August 10th targeting Programme managers, coordinators at Beirut/ National level.
