In Luuq, Gedo region, UNHCR ensured long-term solution for 200 households (1,200 individuals) with constructing 30 latrines, one well and one water tank.



2,204 individuals were reached with Gender Based Violence (GBV) response in Bay region through: identification of survivors, awareness raising and legal, material, medical and psychosocial support.


Situation overview

From 1 to 31 December, the UNHCR-led Protection & Returns Monitoring Network (PRMN), recorded 33,000 new displacements (17,000 drought-related and 15,000 conflict or insecurity related), bringing the total of internal displacements since the beginning of the year to 1,130,000, of which 892,000 attributable to the drought and 203,000 conflict


A spike of 2,000 persons in conflict-induced displacements was noted in Bari region due to airstrikes and armed conflict between Puntland forces and ISIS in Qandala district. In addition, new clan conflict in Cabudwaaq district (Galgaduud) led to new displacements of more than 2,000.


More than 5,000 IDP returns were also monitored during the month from Baidoa district (Bay region) to villages within the same and surrounding districts.
