



RAIS is an Inter-Agency tool for tracking assistance, referrals, and assessment information. It enables UNHCR and partners to share assistance records, cross-check beneficiary lists, and host different types of data. RAIS is synchronized with proGres, UNHCR's registration database, from which refugee data from all UNHCR field offices is updated daily. A data sharing agreement with UNHCR is a prerequisite for accessing RAIS.

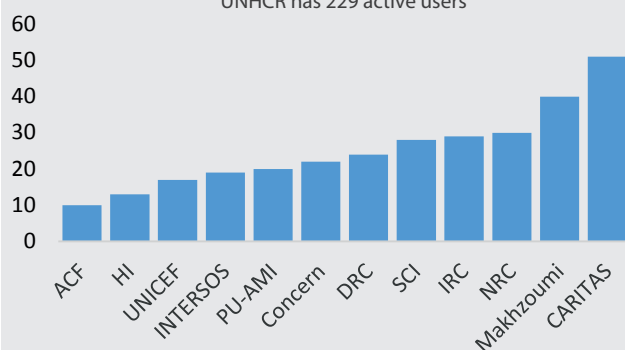
Relevance of RAIS

Reach: Partners need access to basic UNHCR registration data to identify and reach beneficiaries.

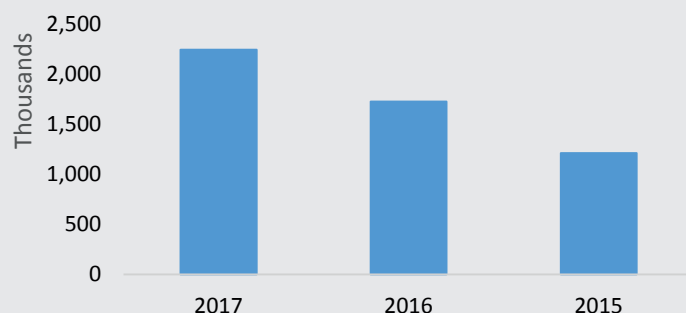
Coordination: Multiple partners deliver similar assistance to refugees in the same geographical areas thereby creating a risk of overlap in assistance provided.

Data Protection: Protection of beneficiaries personal data while at the same time enabling efficient delivery of assistance and identification of needs.

UNHCR has 229 active users



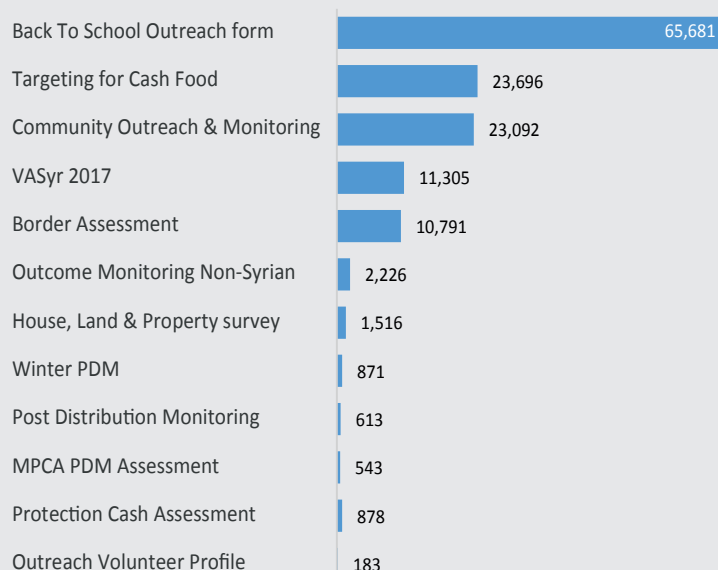
Total number of assistance records reported by year
