HIGHLIGHTS

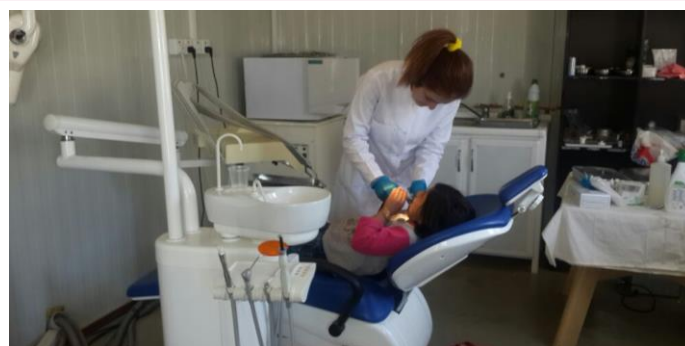
- A total of **27,968 patient consultations** were provided to Syrian refugees living in KR-I, of which (**23,609** PHC consultations) were made through camp-based Primary Health Care Centers for camp refugees by Directorate of Health (DOH) with support from UN agencies. While Mobile Medical Units of international/ national NGOs for non-camp refugees provided (**4359** consultations). Among camp consultations **462** of them were related to mental health and psychosocial support.

- 1,420 patients** were referred from the camp PHCC to secondary and tertiary health facilities in urban areas for further investigations and/or hospitalization.

- Preventive health services** (immunization, growth monitoring, Ante natal care, family planning) were provided in refugee camps by DOH with support from UN agencies.

- UNICEF provided **Infant and Young Child Feeding** counselling assistance on appropriate breastfeeding to **412 pregnant and lactating women**.

- Antenatal care** and family planning services are available in all camps. They are provided by DOH with the support of UNFPA. **337 women** attended one or more antenatal care sessions in the nine refugee camps.

NEEDS ANALYSIS

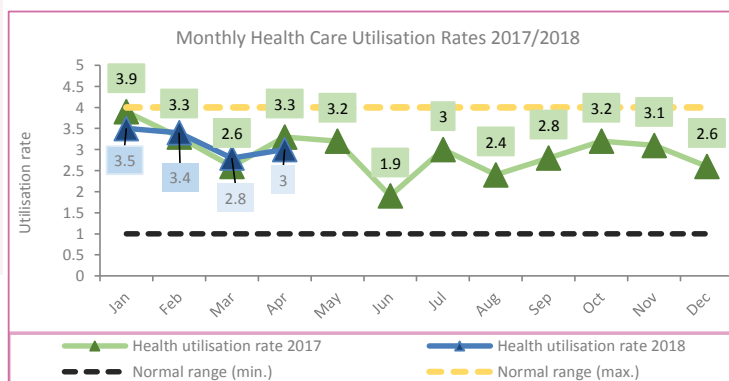
- Shortage of Medicines, especially medicines for chronic diseases, and human resources in public health facilities due to the ongoing financial constraints.

- Lack of awareness on available health services at governmental health facilities for non-camp refugees.

- Spread of measles cases among host community population in Erbil province imposes a potential risk on Syrian refugees both inside and outside the camps.

- Access to mental health and psychosocial support services remains limited for non-camp refugees and needs to be further expanded.

- Lack of community health outreach services in some refugee camps and needs to be expanded to other camps.
