


### Registered persons of concern by country of origin




## Italy Mixed migration and refugee arrivals in Tunisia

In 2017, 1,660 new arrivals within mixed migration flows were referred to Tunisian Red Crescent in Southern Tunisia (Medenine). Since October 2017, all new arrivals have been systematically profiled by UNHCR and partners using Kobo system, for a total number so far of 336 individuals, with the following findings;
