HIGHLIGHTS

Overall Basic Needs Assistance from January to June 2018:

23,000 households have benefited from the sector through **2 modalities of Assistance:**

Core Relief Items (CRIs): 21,000 households benefited from in-kind assistance that included: blankets, mattresses, kitchen sets, cooking stoves, Jerry cans and solar lights.

Targeting mainly newly arrived families

Replenishment of used/torn core relief items

Winter support in January and February

Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance (MPCA): 1050 households (HH) living in urban areas were assisted with some total amount of \$ 780,000 USD.

600 vulnerable households received one month payment of USD 400

450 most vulnerable households received 3 moths payment of total USD 1200.

Only in June 2018: 458 households received total amount of \$ 342,400.

In total, fund (some \$ 4 million) is made available for 4,500 households.

UNHCR is planning to accelerate identification and MPCA provision for vulnerable households.

NEEDS ANALYSIS

Basic Needs requirements are needs for the Syrian Refugees are meant to:

1. Support the newly arrived families start their new life
2. Replace the used/torn items
3. Winterization Program> Protect the refugees from winter cold (that goes below 0 °C Celsius) during 4 months (October to February).

Some 48,000 Syrian Refugees households will need Basic Needs support (Core Relief Items and Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance).

Top primary expenditures of Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance

- Rent
- Health care
- Kerosene for heating
- Food

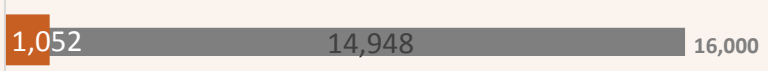
407 newly arrived households (MHH/FHH) received CRIs and basic items
