ECD classrooms remain
in very poor condition**

FOOD


 **57,100**
Burundian refugees in
Mahama camp received
**monthly in-kind food
assistance**


 **27,294**
children received **daily
breakfast** at ECD and
primary school

 **Due to a lack of funding,
food rations were
reduced** to 75%
of the full ration
from Jan - April and
to 85% from May - June

71,640
 outpatient
consultations
conducted
in 2018

**Measles
vaccination
coverage** for
children reached
99% 

Prevalence of **anaemia**
(45%) and **stunting**
(30%) among children
remains high

training for
livelihoods** 



608 Burundian refugee
entrepreneurs **trained
in business skills**
in Mahama camp

**Livelihoods opportunities
for refugee youth remain
limited**, but plans are in place
to include refugee youth in **UNDP
"Youth Connekt"** programme


SHELTER AND NFIS


100%
of new refugee
arrivals received
NFI Kits

 100% of households
received **monthly
soap** & 100% of
women of reproductive age
received **sanitary pads**

 Only **40%** of overall
NFI needs were met
& **over 1,700
semi-permanent
shelters** still require
rehabilitation work 

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

 The **20L**
**of clean water per
person per day standard**
has been met in
Mahama camp

 **91%**
of refugees are
reached by **monthly
hygiene promotion
campaigns**

Only **45%**
of households have
access to **hand
washing stands** &
89% are accessing
communal **latrines**
