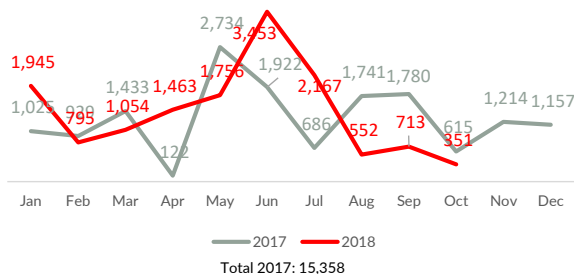


Libya continues to be a transit point for departure from North Africa towards Europe. UNHCR's interventions at disembarkation points in Libya focus on the provision of life-saving assistance and protection monitoring, to identify persons in need of international protection, as well as vulnerable individuals, such as unaccompanied and separated children, elderly, medical cases, women at risk or victims of trafficking. **UNHCR through its partner International Medical Corps provides medical services and core relief items.** In addition, UNHCR rehabilitated WASH facilities at six disembarkation points, in Azzawya, Tripoli (3), Tajoura (Al Hamidiyah) and Alkhums.

As of 31 October 2018, the Libyan Coast Guard rescued/intercepted a total of 14,249 people in different locations along the Libyan coast. 351 individuals were rescued/intercepted in October, 713 in September and 552 in August. Since 1 January 2018, Libyan local authorities have recovered 99 bodies of people who perished while attempting to cross the Mediterranean towards Europe.

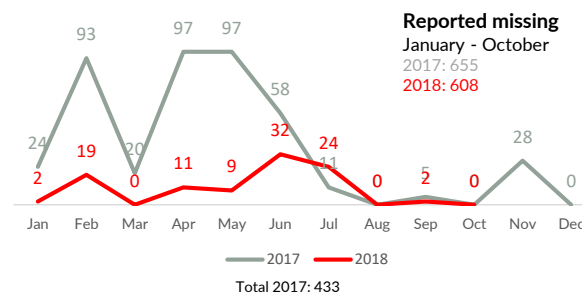
Monthly trends - people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2017-2018

From January to October 2018, 14,249 people were rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, an increase of 9.7% compared to the same period in 2017.

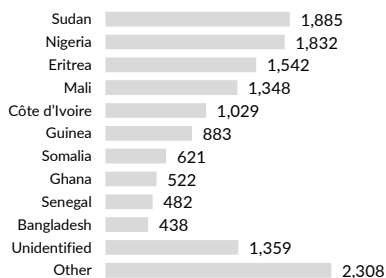


Monthly trends - recorded loss of life in Libyan waters in 2017-2018

From January to October 2018, 99 dead bodies were recovered in Libyan waters, compared to 405 over the same period in 2017.

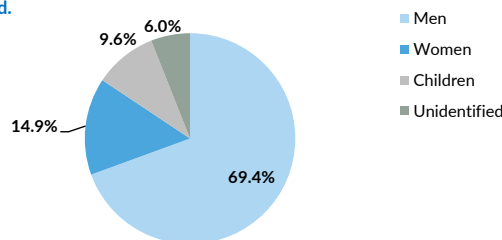


Top 10 nationalities rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2018

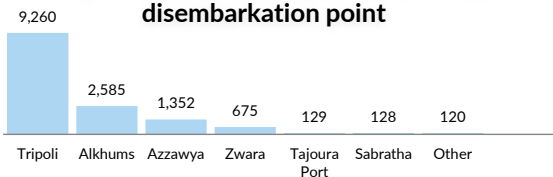


People rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard in 2018 by group

Of the total of 14,249 people rescued/intercepted at sea by the Libyan Coast Guard, 9,893 were men, 2,126 women, 1,374 children and 856 unidentified.

As of 31 October 2018, UNHCR, through its partner International Medical Corps, provided medical assistance to 1,570 people and distributed 9,230 hygiene kits at six health posts.
