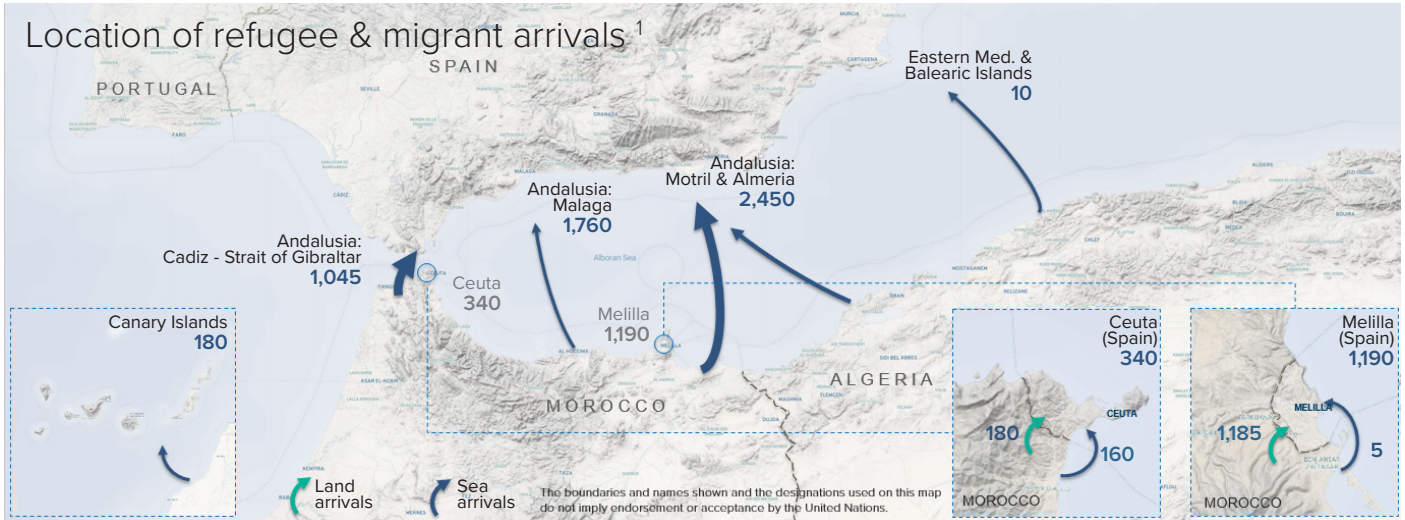

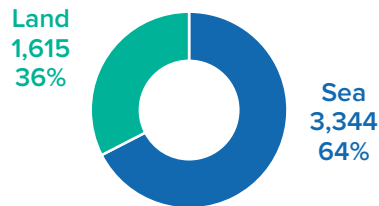
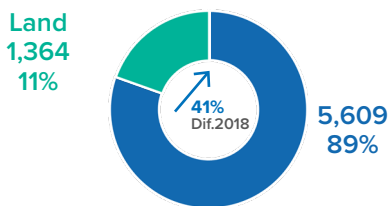

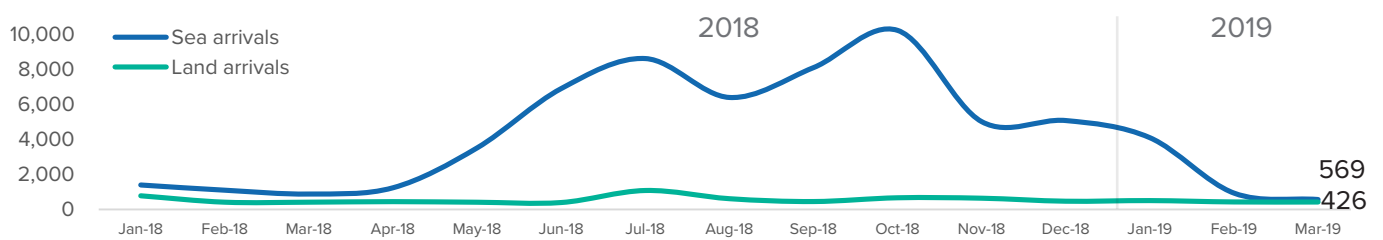

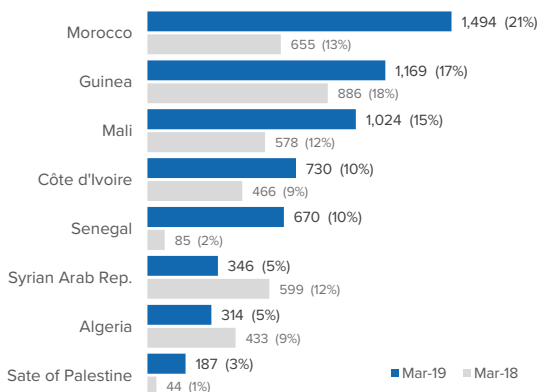

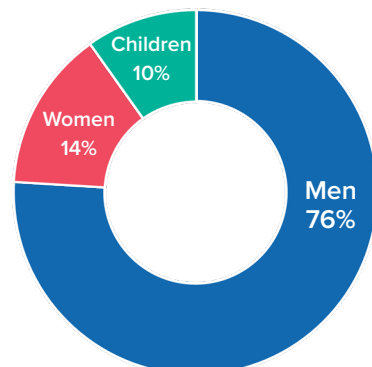
Arrivals trend by month

Demography of arrivals, Jan-Mar 2019



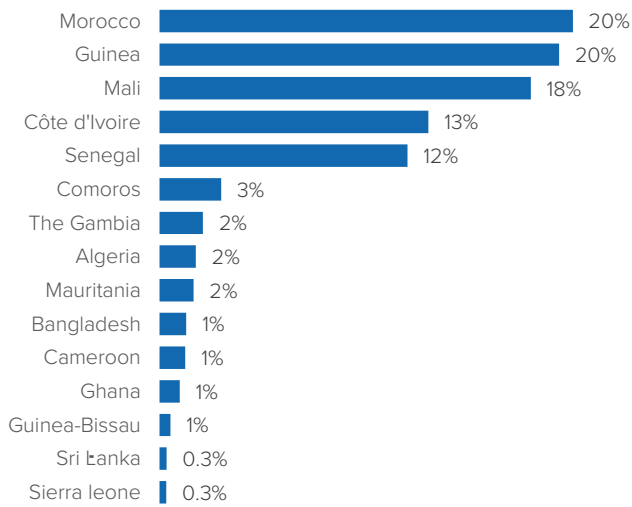

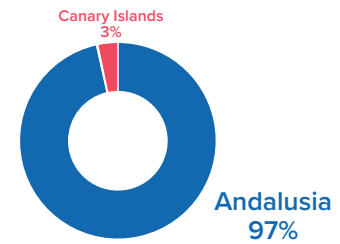

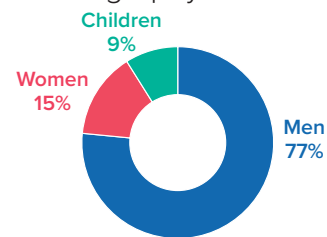
Most common nationalities



Arrivals by region



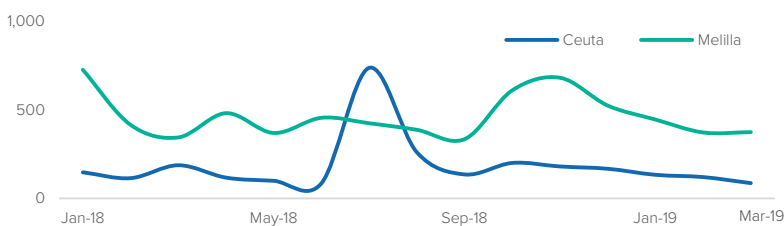

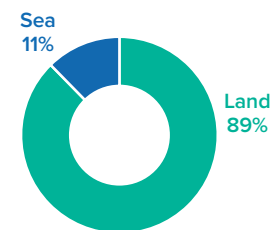

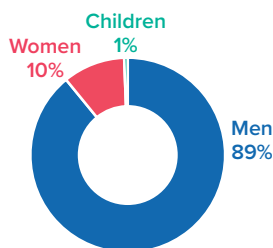

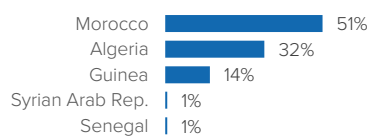

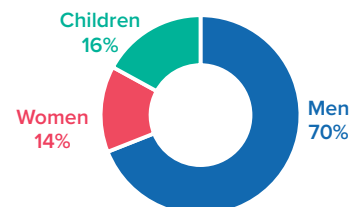

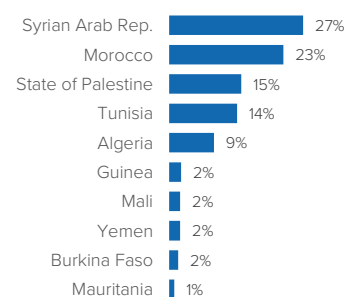
