- the most favourable treatment accorded to nationals of a foreign country in the same circumstances,

- Self-employment

- Treatment as favourable as possible, and at least on par with aliens generally in the same circumstances

Article 19

- Practicing liberal professions
- Lawfully staying
- Treatment as favourable as possible, and at least on par with aliens generally in the same circumstances

To develop, review and amend national policies and legislations to;

- a. Strengthen free movement of refugees within countries of asylum and simplify related procedures;
- Expand access to labour markets by simplifying procedures for accessing employment including work permits, self-employment and business opportunities;
- c. Improve access to services including justice, education, health, financial services and markets;
- d. Ensure the inclusion of the needs of refugees and returnees in national and local development plans;
- e. Ensure national and local development plans aimed at achieving social cohesion and equitable access to social and economic resources, as well as opportunities in refugee hosting areas are supported by the international community;
- f. Promote the equality of opportunity and treatment for all refugees in accordance to national policies and laws;
- g.Safeguard the freedom of non-political association and rights at work in accordance to national policies, laws and ratified international labour standards;
