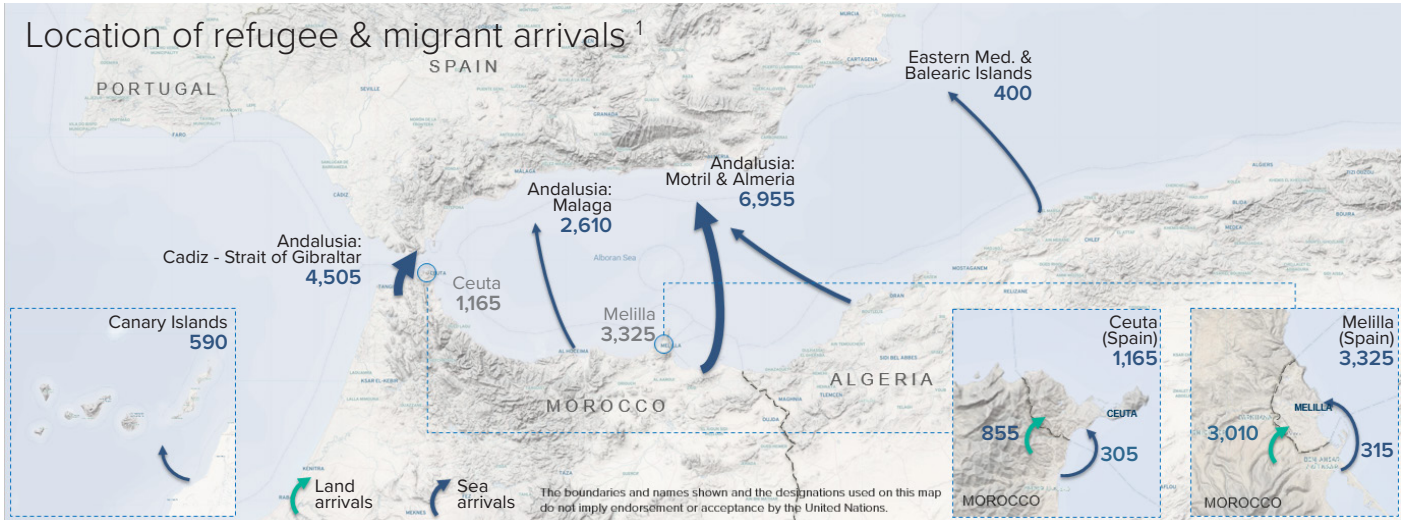

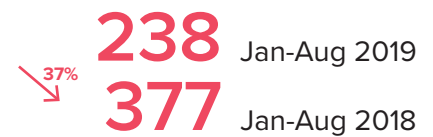

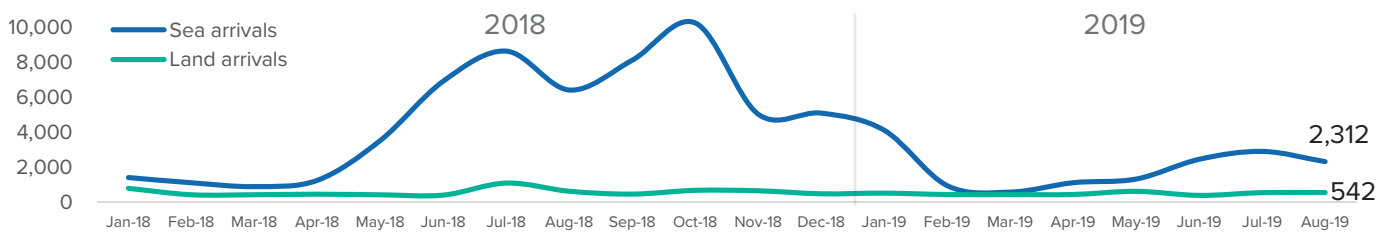

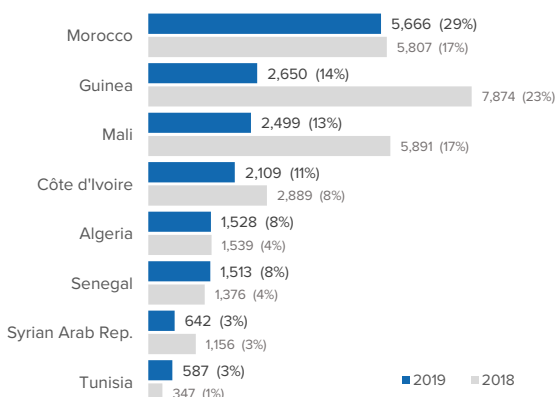

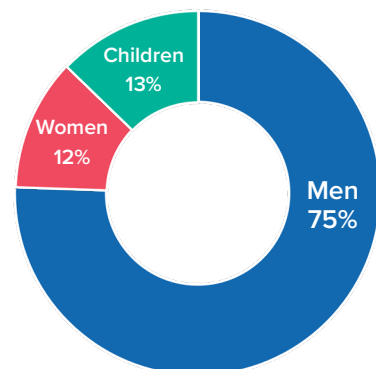
Arrivals trend by month

Demography of arrivals, Jan-Aug 2019



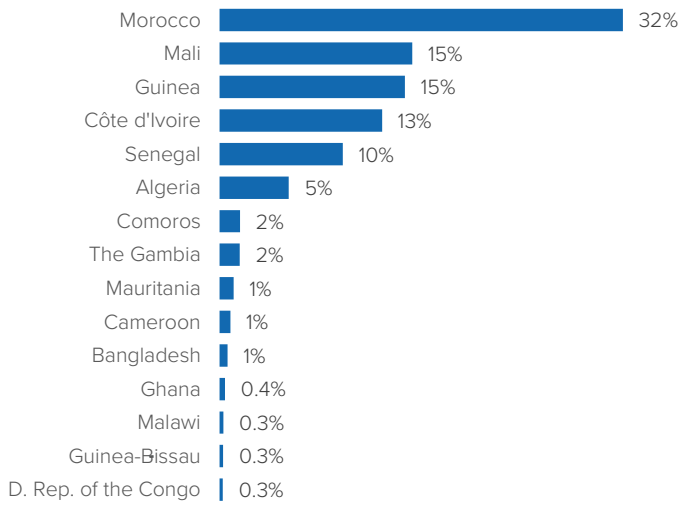

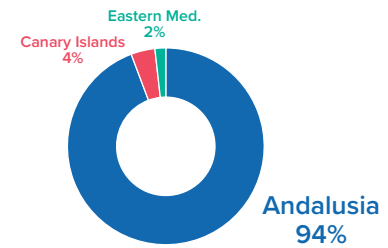

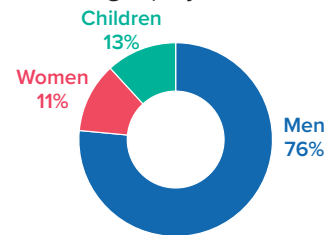

Arrivals by region

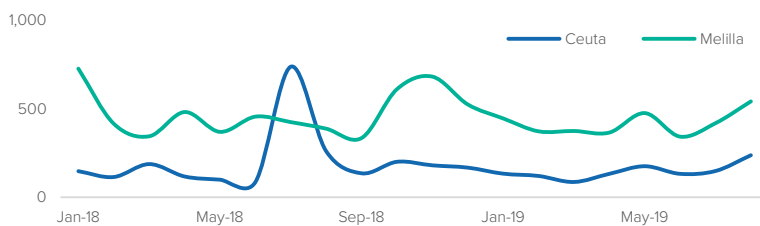

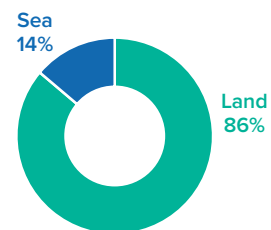

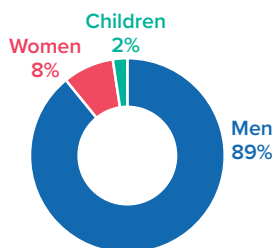

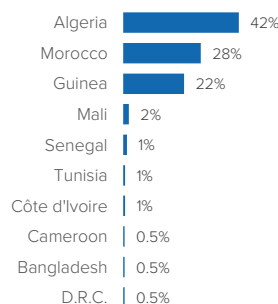

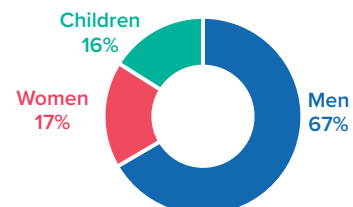

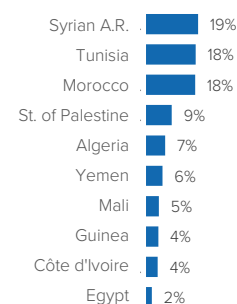
