 AOB and updates MoPIC, with assistance of USAID and UK has identified a number of companies working in the economic zone interested in the rule of origin's agreement that Jordan has signed on to. Companies and will be trained in Sahab and Irbid on how to apply for the Rules of Origin according to the new regime as well as on requirements to export to Europe. These companies will be linked to the European market. The companies will start looking for the mandatory quota of Syrians to be employed after this first phase is concluded (the companies are expected to have 15% of their labour to be Syrian within the first year). NGOS and organizations will play a role in matching and helping companies recruit Syrian refugees once all the other conditions are met.
