New UNHCR Malawi Representative Ms. Fatima Mohammed-Cole presented her credentials to Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation Honourable Francis Kasaila on Thursday, 30 January 2020 to officially commence her tour of duties in Malawi.

The Minister welcomed the new Representative to Malawi and requested her to continue with the good work UNHCR has been doing to refugees, asylum seekers and internally displaced persons. In her response, Ms. Fatima Mohammed-Cole assured the Minister of UNHCR's commitment to continue working with the Government of Malawi which is a strong partner in pushing for the refugee agenda.

The two also discussed a number of issues of benefit to both the persons of concern and nationals. Later on, the new Representative paid a courtesy call to Minister of Homeland Security Honourable Nicholas Dausi whose Ministry has the Department of Refugees and is a strong partner of UNHCR.

Ms. Fatima Mohammed-Cole started her mission as UNHCR Malawi Representative on 15 January 2020. Prior to joining UNHCR Malawi she was Representative for UNHCR Liberia.
