

U | Main Topics Voiced by Refugees

COVID-19 National Vaccination Programme:

- Questions on receiving the vaccine, steps after registration
- Fears remain over safety and efficacy of the vaccine

UNHCR Financial Assistance:

- Questions revolve around any upcoming distribution phases for the COVID-19 emergency assistance
- Increased questions over the UNHCR eligibility criteria for financial assistance and home visits carried out by Mindset

Non-Syrian community:

- Concerns remain about certain opportunities being made available for Syrian refugees only, such as higher education scholarships and healthcare
- Questions on "de-registering" as asylum seekers in order to issue work permits in Jordan, mainly from the Yemeni community

Remote services during the pandemic:

• Accessibility to services, backlog and appointments remain major concerns for refugees as their Asylum Seeker/Refugee Certificates expire
