- ♦ Launching of the **Nursing & Health Care Simulation Labs at LTUC**
- ♦ Launching of **2 DAFI Virtual Reality Labs** in Amman and Irbid
- ♦ **Subsidized fees and fees reduction** offered to self-sponsored refugee students by 4 Jordanian universities
- ♦ Delivering Training of Trainers “Career Counselling Courses” to DAFI students
- ♦ Screening of **100 SRP-WUSC refugee applicants**, 86 conducted language placement test at the Community Support Committees in urban and camps
- ♦ **70 refugee students** applied to the Progetto Mediterraneo Scholarship from Jordan
- ♦ **MENA Civil Society Network for Displacement** joined the Global Refugee Forum Stocktaking & NGO/Civil Society Consultations to reflect on progress towards implementation of the GCR and take stock of the pledges made at the GRF considering the context of COVID-19
- ♦ Higher Education institutions signed a memorandum of understanding with the Ministry of Higher Education on transferring the sign language translation to support persons with disabilities inclusion

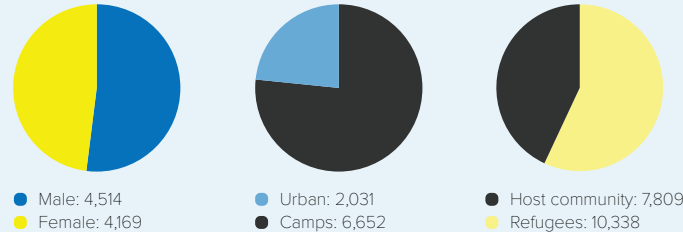

## KEY UNHCR ACTIVITIES



Monitoring, coordination & advocacy to address protection needs

- **Maintain productive coordination with relevant stakeholders** (UNICEF, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Higher Education and UNESCO);
- Provide **technical support for the merged working group** handling the **basic, secondary and higher education**;
- Strengthen **Cross-Sector Coordination** to ensure **safe and equal educational opportunities** for all refugee children;
- Advocate for the **strengthening of national policies**, namely the National Education Strategy Plan (ESP), through supporting the implementation of the plan;
- Advocate for the **inclusion of all refugee students** to the formal and national educational system;
- Implement **partner capacity building and safeguards** for education staff.



Strengthen community-based support to education

- Strengthen **implementation, coordination and technical capacity** of partners delivering education projects in the community;
- Delivery of **Early Intervention and Special Education programmes** in the community setting;
- Capacity building for **teachers, carers and parents** to cater for education needs of children with disabilities or learning difficulties;
- Exploring **opportunities** with partners and stakeholders advocating for **educational inclusion of children with disabilities**.



Expand and diversify access to tertiary education opportunities

- Advocate to **expand in-country universities and third country scholarship opportunities**;
- Countrywide outreach strategy to **disseminate information on tertiary education opportunities**, as well as membership in scholarship selection panels;
- Provide **academic extra circular support programmes** to tertiary education students;
- Engage with **private sector education service providers**;
- Advocate for **One Refugee approach** by exploring & offering new TVET opportunities to refugees of all nationalities.



Community learning & innovative education hubs

- Expand **digital/connected learning community hubs**;
- Provide **digital learning services “Kolibri” platform** in all community centres countrywide;
- Training for the faculty of some **private and public Jordanian universities on how to implement connected learning** in different academic programmes;
- Countrywide **focus group discussions** with youth and adolescents on the **impact of blended and online learning** opportunities;
- Inclusion of new higher education & career-readiness platforms;
- Provide inter-disciplinary programmes links innovative learning, technology, youth and TVET/career-readiness programmes together
